

#### Cardiff v. Neath

WELL, LAST SATURDAY may not have been pretty — if you think about it, not many matches with Pontypridd would qualify even for the heats of the "most beautiful game of the year" title — but it was pretty effective.

And sometime in the next eight or nine months, there may be good cause for Cardiff to look back on Saturday's untidy, yet workmanlike, victory at Sardis Road and sigh with relief that not only did they win but that they do not have to play there on a mudheap in, say, February.

Be thankful, then, for the two points and for the fitness which kept Cardiff going to the bitter end and to retain a lead gained by the faultless Mike Rayer's boot against the inaccurate for once kicking of Neil Jenkins.

It means, of course, that both Cardiff and Neath go into the match this evening with 100 per cent records from their two matches, Neath having so far beaten both Treorchy and Pontypool at the Gnoll.

The pressures for victory tonight are great on both sides and yet we can surely anticipate a rather more creative and innovative 80 minutes than on Saturday when one Cardiff player apologised to your programme editor. When asked what the apology was for, the player answered, "it was bad enough playing in it, watching it must have been murder".


In our programme for the first match against Bridgend, coaching organiser Alex Evans and skipper Mike Hall had warned that winning rugby could not always be open, running rugby and that, in order to make an impact on the Heineken League, Cardiff must be prepared and able to adapt to the exigencies of the day, the opposition and the referee.

Certainly, no one can gainsay the total commitment at Pontypridd and a similar spirit will be required this Thursday evening, as we welcome most warmly the players, officials and followers of Neath and thank Reebok for their match sponsorship. After this, there's the little matter of Swansea at St. Helens and Llanelli here on October 1st.





# **IDENTITY CRISIS FOR RUGBY FOOTBALL**

INSANITY has been defined as doing things over and over again the same way and expecting different results. If that is so, then Rugby Union has a lot of insane people associated with the game.

Words written in jest of course, before any administrator, player, coach or spongeman picks up the phone to his friendly solicitor.

The game of Rugby Union, if not professional already, nudge, nudge, wink, wink, is scorching with great momentum in that direction.

World Cups in 1987 and 1991 have set the scene that has changed the fabric of the game. Payments. irrespective of how vague their description, however unspecified their scope, once agreed and paid, means that amateur rugby, as we have known it, is finished. As with pregnancy, you cannot be a little bit amateur.

My new role at Cardiff Athletic Club will, I am sure, be under the microscope. Some traditional diehards I know will hover like bloodthirsty vultures, awaiting my fatal fall.

Other. more progressive supporters of the Club and of Welsh sport, will hope that I can play a part in improving the organisation and underline the necessity professional management in sport.

One of my objectives, as defined by the Club, is to ensure that Cardiff R.F.C. establishes itself as a top club in the world of rugby and that we are at the forefront of the development of the game of rugby both nationally and internationally. Other duties include the responsibility for all aspects of the management and development of Cardiff Athletic Club.

Sport and rugby in particular at the

highest level has evolved and outgrown the volunteer culture. People will still play the game and enjoy the social aspect of the sport which has been its hallmark for generations. But at the sharp end of international and top league rugby, the environment has changed radically.

Competitive leagues and cups have drastically changed the environment in which the game is played, which has accordingly generated increased media exposure. This has created extra commercial opportunities to exploit. which is essential to nurture a more professional approach to the game, in which players are "looked after" and prepared through highly sophisticated and thorough training schedules.

It is a fact that the gap, between the top players and those enjoying a runout with the gin and tonic 4th XVs, is wide and becoming wider.

Rugby, I believe, is undergoing an identity crisis, where the unique culture that has been established for well over a century is being diminished. Those who have been involved in the game have a passion which is strengthened by its amateur qualities, although for the vast majority this will still apply.

Rugby will have a more defined elite and this. I believe, should not harm the game.

In other sports, golf for example, the ability of a Nick Faldo to earn millions in a year has not detracted



from the ordinary Club golfer; I cannot even get on the Cardiff Golf Club as it is so well used.

So why the administrators and governors of the game do not come clean and seriously address what is actually going on is beyond me. It is surely not unreasonable to ask for the miscreants to come forward and confess their "sins". They are, after all, the custodians of the game and it is incumbent on them to either enforce the laws of the game or amend the laws whenever they become outdated or unworkable.

Clubs such as Cardiff, although high profile, will over the next few years face many challenges, with the serious possibility of facing up to the professional world. Their organisation and structure must be ahead of the game and prepared to face any change that lies ahead. This, of course, will not mean the dissolution of the Committee structure but will necessitate a more thorough appraisal of how Committees juxtapose with the professional employees.

Both must be prepared to make adjustments. The professionals must be aware of the history and culture of the game, whilst the Committee must accept that managers be allowed to manage.

Where do my sentiments lie? I am still trying to evaluate a Management Consultant's recent remark that "Nothing is impossible until it goes to Committee".

I shall have to experience for myself how matters evolve but I am relishing the challenge presented by returning to my old stamping ground at the Arms Park.

#### YOUTH CAN HAVE ITS FLING

Before the friendly with Pontypool, the Cardiff Youth side will play Moseley Youth as a colourful curtain-raiser (kick-off 1 p.m.).

Cardiff's youth team got away to a cracking start with a 69-5 victory over Pembroke (full details of teams and scorers on page 15) and the team manager Jim O'Donnell feels that there are exciting times ahead.

"We have with us for example five boys who were in the successful Welsh Schools Australian tour in the summer — Phil Booth (prop), Steve Gardner (second row), Richard Field, Andrew Grabham and Jamie Ringer (all back row).

"Then there's a big lad from Dinas Powys called Philip Savage. He's 6 ft. 7, 17 stone and only 17 years old," enthuses Jim, who promises 15-man rugby.

Well, we can see for ourselves on Saturday.

#### WINNING WORK-OUT

AND THINKING of the sides further down the line, the Seconds and Under 21s have had a mixed start.

In the curtain-raiser to the Bridgend

CARDIFF are of course well represented in the Welsh squad who will shortly be flying to Rumania in a match which will help decide in which group Wales will appear in the World Cup finals in South Africa next summer.

Skipper Mike Hall, full back Mike Rayer and Hemi Taylor are all named in the side to play in Bucharest on September 17.

Hemi — already nicknamed Emyr by one clubhouse group in honour of his acquired Welsh status and before the recent arrival of Emyr Lewis from Llanelli who will also surely be pressing his international claims shortly (he's

among the replacements after being dropped by Wales for the first time after 28 caps) — will be winning his sixth cap.

#### **TESTING TIME**

RECENT REVELATIONS about drug abuse in athletics has brought some queries from members asking whether checks are made on rugby players.

To which the answer is "yes, indeed". Before internationals, for example, the numbers of two players are drawn and kept secret with the players of those numbers from each side tested after the match.

At club level? After last May's Cup Final, two Cardiff players – and two from Llanelli – were tested.

And, occasionally, inspectors will drop in on league games to carry out similar tests — possibly twice a season at each first division club.

She is a chartered and state-enrolled physiotherapist and holds a Diploma in Practical and Academic Physiotherapy for sports injuries after time in the London Hospital Department of Sports Medicine.

Jane had a yen to return to Wales and discovered when Cardiff played London Welsh last season that the Club wanted a physio to work closely with the team. "I was available at the right time, came down to watch the match with the Barbarians and .... here I am.


"Clearly, there is a difference in the standards of the clubs at the moment and it was a big move to come to Cardiff," says the woman who is also a qualified gymnastics coach. "I was nervous before the first game but Bridgend have had a lady physio for four years so it's nothing really new.

"And, of course, I don't deal with the cuts and first aid type of injury. My job is all about toning up, stretching, mobilisation, flexibility . . . ."

Among other sporting activities, Jane has also looked after Cambridge and Oxford University rugby league sides and the Welsh Exiles.

In short, she's seen and heard it all before. As for rugby knowledge, well, she's got a fair amount of that also. "But in my job, you are not following the game. You are probably following certain players who may be carrying problems."

The post is not full-time and Jane is considering a consultancy role within a sports clinic also as a freelance. You listen to her talking about the biomechanics of rugby, and about sports injuries in general, and you know why Alex Evans wanted her at Cardiff.







#### **KNOW THE LAWS**

sponsored by MORGAN BRUCE

J. E. MALCOLM THOMAS discusses some of the problems which may arise from amendments to Law 14.



#### IN - GOAL

Section 4 of Law 14 governing IN-GOAL has now been amended as follows:

A If an attacking player charges down the ball from an opponent's kick and it travels into his opponent's IN-GOAL area - and is then grounded by a defending player - a DROP OUT 22 metres will be awarded.

Therefore if the kick is taken within the IN-GOAL area, even if the defending team were responsible for the ball entering the IN-GOAL area, and the ball is charged down by an opponent in the field of play and the ball travels back into IN-GOAL and is then made dead by the defending player - the referee shall award a DROP OUT on the 22 metre line.

**But, however,** if the ball having entered the IN-GOAL area by the actions of the defending team, is then kicked by a member of the defending team, and is charged down by an attacking player in the IN-GOAL area and made dead by the defending team - then a 5 metre scrummage attacking side ball shall be awarded.




