CARDIFF v. LLANELLI – THE FACTS

BOTH THE earliest and the most recent matches between the two clubs were, curiously, in Cup finals. Last May, of course, Cardiff beat Llanelli 15-8 to win the SWALEC Cup; on the first-ever occasion that the teams met – in the final of the South Wales Challenge Cup on March 12, 1881 at Neath before a crowd of about 1,500 – there was no score at full-time.

A gentleman called Percy K. Heard scored the winning try for Cardiff in extra time, "whereupon the crowd," writes Danny Davies in the Cardiff history, "rushed on to the field and because Mitchell, one of the Llanelli players, refused to give up the ball, the kick for goal was not taken."

In all, Cardiff have won 119 of the 224 matches played with Llanelli winning 85 and 20 matches drawn. Cardiff have scored 2,270 points, Llanelli 1,799 – but results in the Heineken League have gone very strongly in Llanelli's favour with Cardiff having only one win and one draw (Hemi Taylor's last-minute try at Stradey last season, converted by Adrian Davies) against six defeats.

Oddly, both sides have scored 144 points in those league matches. Cardiff's 43-0 home victory over a severely weakened Llanelli four seasons ago making up the discrepancy of 16-22, 22-28, 6-22, 16-20, 13-18 and 9-15 defeats.

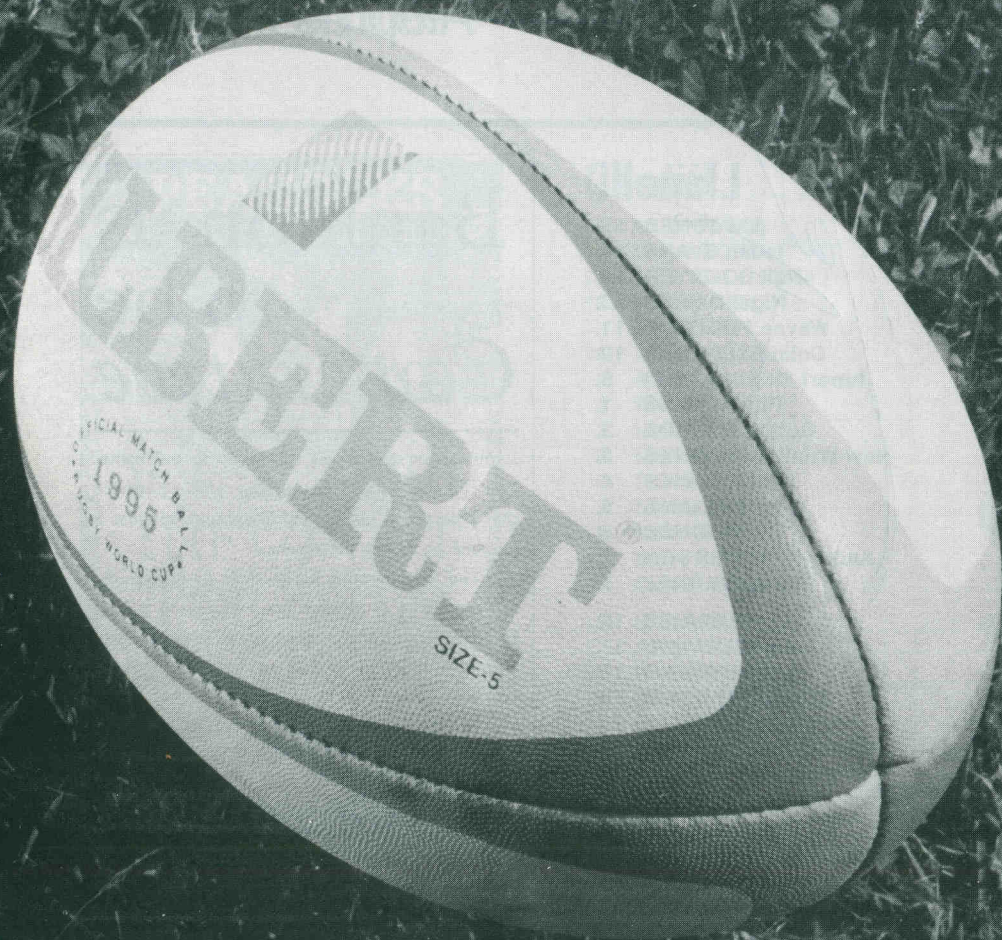

a ball becomes unplayable in
a ruck and in a maul.



'AN IMPORTANT DISTINCTION'

A. SCRUM FOLLOWING A RUCK

When the ball in a ruck becomes unplayable, a scrum must be ordered. **The team that was moving forward before the ruck stopped moving shall put in the ball.** If neither team was moving forward, or if the referee cannot decide which team was moving forward, the attacking team puts in the ball.

Before whistling for a scrum the referee should allow a reasonable time for the ball to emerge from the ruck, especially if either team is moving forward.

B. SCRUM FOLLOWING A MAUL

When a maul becomes stationary, or the ball in a maul becomes unplayable, a scrum must be ordered. **The ball shall be put in by the team that was NOT in possession when the maul began.** If the referee cannot decide which team was in possession, then the team that was moving forward before the maul stopped moving shall put in the ball. If neither team was moving forward, then the attacking team puts in the ball. **Once the maul has stopped moving the referee must not let it start moving again. He must order a scrum.**

If a player in a maul goes to ground, including being on one or both knees, or sitting, the referee should order a scrum unless the ball is **immediately** available.

C. SCRUM AFTER A MAUL WHEN THE CATCHER IS HELD

If a player catches the ball **direct** from an opponent's kick, **except** from a kick off or a drop out, and the player is **immediately held by an opponent so that a maul forms, and the maul becomes stationary or the ball becomes unplayable**, and a scrum is ordered — **then the team of the player who caught the ball shall put in the ball.**

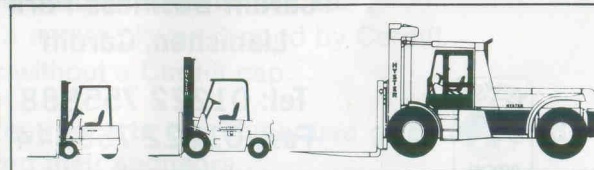
If such a maul moves into the players **IN-GOAL** where the ball is touched down or becomes unplayable, then a 5 metre scrum is formed and the attacking team puts in the ball.
