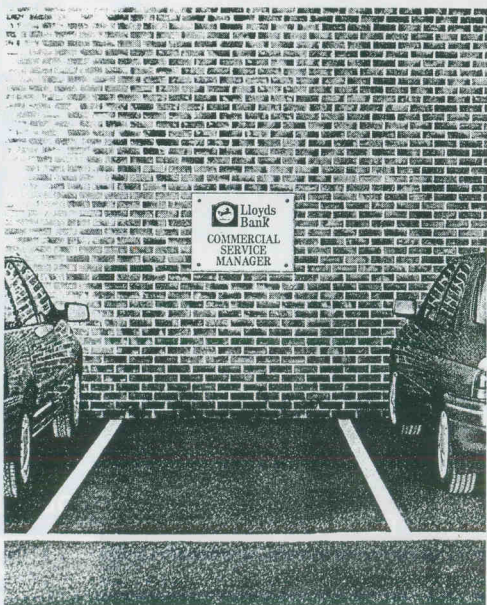

Cardiff v. Pontypool

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 29th, 1994

KICK-OFF 2.30 p.m.

UNDERSTANDABLY, there was dissatisfaction among members at the arrangements, and most especially, the prices for last Saturday's match at the neighbouring National Ground with the South Africans.

This dissatisfaction which led to a disappointing gate was felt perhaps most of all by the players who believe that a capacity crowd on our own ground would have created the atmosphere for them to raise their game.

"The arrangements were not unfortunately up to us," explains Gareth Davies, "and I can only assure Cardiff supporters that on any future occasions when we play a touring side that different arrangements will be discussed with the Welsh Rugby Union."

"In fact, the prices were not raised in order that Cardiff would make money from the game. Commercially, all we make, after expenses, is the receipts from the match programme. The gate receipts go to the WRU."

"We would have welcomed the chance to promote further the game of rugby football in Cardiff at a time when the economics of the game are becoming ever more complicated."

Meanwhile, Cardiff are considering options for two games planned over the Christmas holiday period. The club would be interested in the views of supporters on the Christmas Eve match with Pontypridd, which could be crucial in terms of league points.

Should the club seek to have a rearrangement — or will people be happy to come out on Christmas Eve? Your opinions, please.

On Boxing Day, a "festival"-type match is being planned with an invitation XV filled, it is hoped, with star personalities when other, different types of entertainment are also being considered.

In the meantime, however, it is back to the League with Pontypool the attractive opposition this afternoon. We welcome warmly their players, committee and followers as always, and welcome and thank also the director of Coal Products Ltd, the sponsors of today's match. We hope that they and their guests — and all others at the Arms Park — have a thoroughly entertaining afternoon.

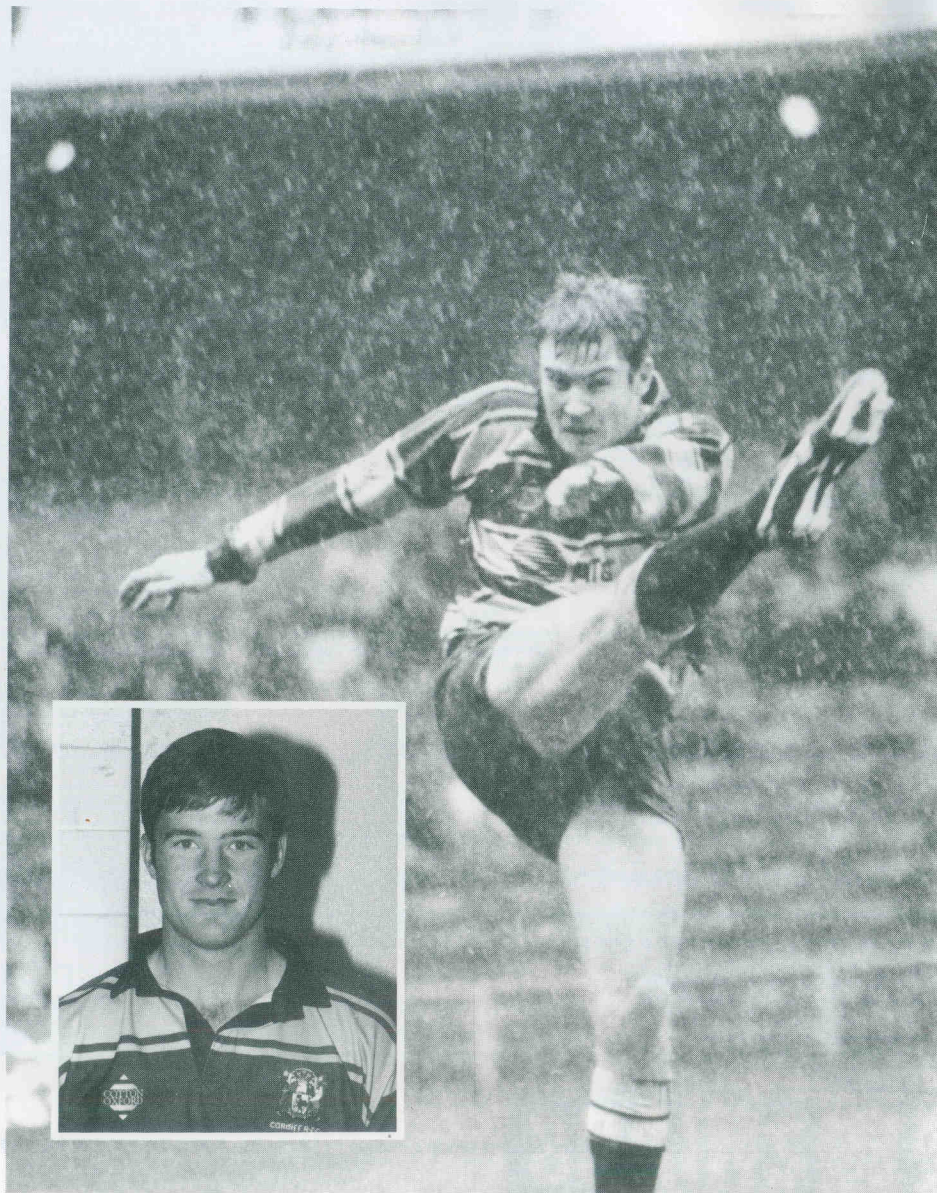

QUIDNUNC'S COLUMN...

AND SONG CONTEST RESULTS

BEING A SENTIMENTAL slob at heart — he was never a soft centre, more a yellow No 8 in his prime — Quidnunc was seeking something romantic, slushy even, when he set the competition in the Llanelli programme a month ago to find songs to match the Cardiff players — or, more accurately, their names.

With reluctance, then, "Grease Lightning" for Nigel Walker — suggested by two or three entrants — "Simply the best" for Hemi Taylor — and Adrian Davies, Mike Hall and Mike Rayer, "Keep on Running" for Steve Ford "Bigger than Texas" for Derwyn the Legend, were discarded.

Closer to the judge's views were "Ear We go" for Mike Budd and "Unforgettable" for Mike Rayer (these entered before Mike's injury). I liked also the small cynicism behind Craig Price's suggestions of "They're Missing you Like Crazy" for Emyr Lewis.

Walter's list included: "My Huw Bevan" (to My Blue Heaven, of course), "You'll never Walker lone," "A hunting we Mustoe" (Or "You Mustoe been a beautiful baby"), "Have I told you Laity that I love you," "Simon chanted Evening," "Ford he's a Jolly Goodfellow," "The Whole town's talking about the Jones boy," "That's a-Moore(A)" (Amore, Geddit?) and "When Mike Hall on you."

There was even one for the coach. "Alec to get you on a slow boat to China!"

"If one of the above should win," writes "Walter," "please donate the prize of an autographed action photograph to the Junior Blue and Blacks Christmas raffle, or whatever."

Job done, Walt, and thanks.

There were one or two religious allusions. Not, of course, that he's always played full-back. (Indeed, he has represented Cardiff in all the back positions other than scrum-half).

Having collected local Bridgend honours at Under 11, 15 and 16 levels at either wing or on the flank (missing competitive years because of the teachers' strike), he emerged further to play for the Wales Under 18s but missed several chances as the result of dislocating a knee when promoted from the Possibles to the Probables (in opposition to Jason Hewlett).

By the time he was winning Welsh

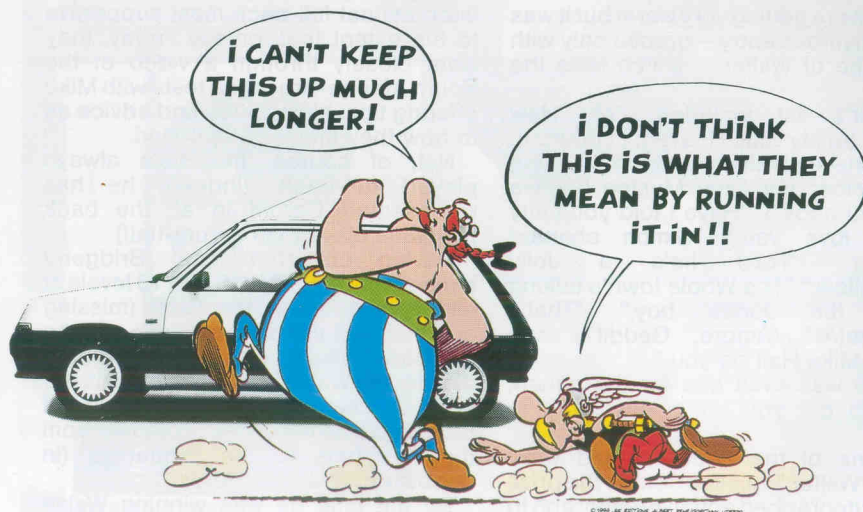

CARDIFF v. PONTYPOOL – THE FACTS

THE CLUBS have met on 166 occasions, with Cardiff winning 107 times, Pontypool 43 and 16 matches drawn. Cardiff have scored 3162 points, Pooler 1406.

Cardiff have won six of the eight League matches with a points difference of 236 to 138. The last five Cardiff victories have been won consecutively after two of the first three had brought Pontypool successes (including a 24-10 win at the Arms Park in season 1991-92.)

Not once in the league series has fewer than 33 points been scored (as Cardiff won 17-16 at Pontypool Park last season but earlier this year) with the highest scoring being the Cardiff victories by 78-0 (also last season), 41-16 and 31-24 (in 1992-93) and Pooler's 36-14 triumph in 1990-91.

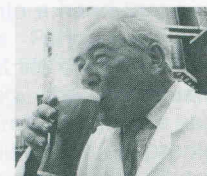

THE PONTYPOOL GRUNT ROW

WE'VE ALL heard the oldie about Lord Lucan.

Found — playing on the wing for Pontypool.

And the equally venerable tale about the new scrum-half being given a tour of the sacred turf by the great Ray Prosser.

"Now when you get your own ball yeer on your own line, yow kicks, right? And when you gets the ball on our 25, you kicks. Right?"

"And yeer we are on the 'alfway line. Get the ball now and..."

"Kick?" asked the youngster, overawed by the Presence.

"Right! Then when you gets the ball on *their* 25, you... kick."

"And then," said Ray, "our wonderful, incredible, marvellous pack takes play to 15 yards out. The ball comes out and what do you do?"

"Kick?" asks the innocent.

A scornful eyebrow-raised look. Then, "Course not. That's when you gives the ball to your outside-half. I forget 'is name but 'e's wearing Number 10."

A Prosser pause. The scrum-half is drinking it all in.

"Then 'e kicks."

Well, times have changed. No one forgets the name of Pooler's current outside-half and few in Cardiff will forget that halcyon year when Ringo teamed up with David Bishop to form

perhaps the most potent half-back partnership in the Northern Hemisphere.

When Bish won the Man of the Match award after Pooler beat Swansea in the 1983 Cup Final, he must have brought a glow to that tough old organ beating beneath Pross's leathery skin.

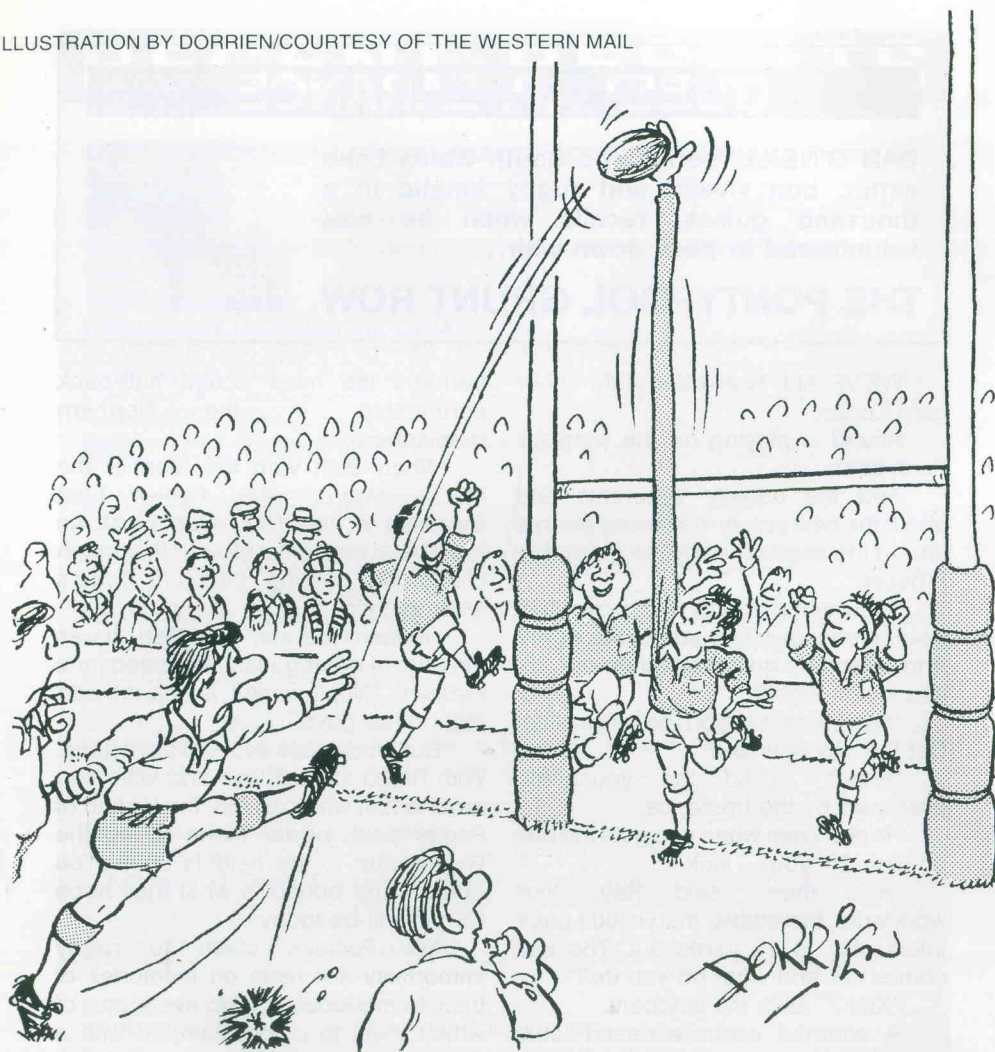
"It wasn't just me," said Bish. "It was me and 14 other guys." He mused for a moment. "No, it wasn't. It was me and eight other guys."

But those days seem to have gone. With Ringo still sublime and with men around him who can run, the legend of Pooler pack power alone taking the Gwent club to the heights should be buried. And buried is what they hope Cardiff will be today.

Yet Pooler's claim to rugby immortality still rests on memories of their tremendous packs, every one of which used to come stamped with a Government Health warning, Prosser Can Seriously Damage Your Health.

No Cardiff fan will ever forget the midweek game a few years ago when Terry Holmes met up in midfield with Pooler's iron man Chris Huish, Exit Holmesey. The balconies on every Westgate Street flat sagged beneath the weight of supporters who couldn't get into the ground. The atmosphere was electric. In short, a typical Cardiff-Pontypool game.

arm topped by a giant fist. Thankfully, that fist turned into a hand that gently stroked my face. Perky was merely showing me what life could be like.

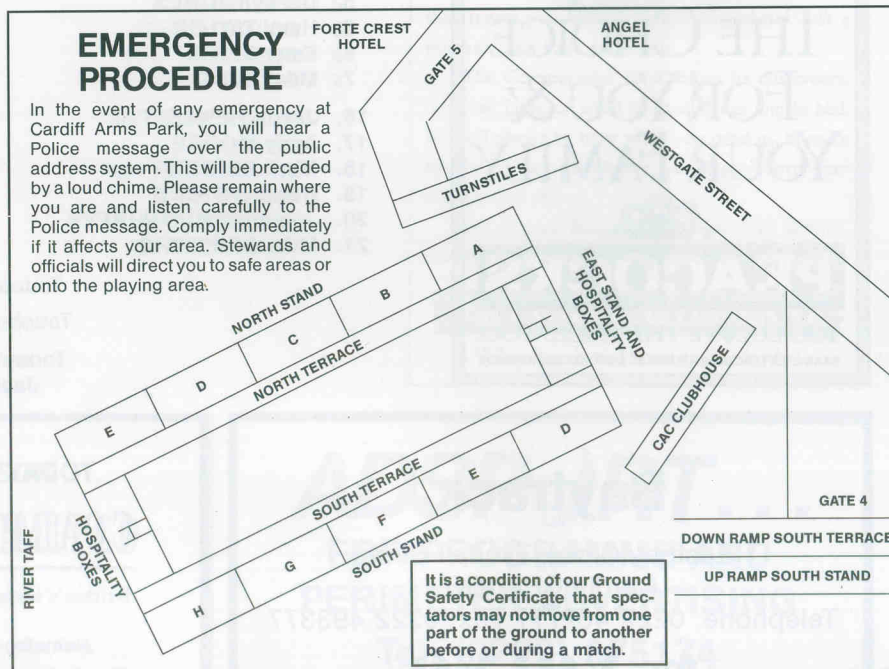

'DIGGING OUT'

One of the consequences of having bodies on the ground is that often the ball becomes trapped and a player has to "dig the ball out."

When players are on the ground or the ball is stuck in a ruck or maul, is it desirable for a player to be allowed to dig it out?

Do the laws provide for this to happen? Can a player dig out while on his knees? Should this be allowed? Do the laws provide protection for the player digging out?

A player can "dig out" the ball from a pile up **providing he is on his feet and the ball is immediately available**. Therefore, a player who digs the ball out while on his knees should be penalised and told to keep on his feet.

Digging out usually occurs at **pile-ups**. Referees have been sympathetic to sides moving forward and allowing pile-ups to continue too long.

Often, you see a maul moving forward, then it goes to ground and the ball is trapped. The scrum half attempts to pick the ball out of the pile-up and resorts to using the boot. Is this desirable? Is it good ball? Should it be allowed? Referees are advised that if a player sees the ball he may use his boot to move the ball **but not place the boot on a player and stamp**. If an opponent is holding on to the ball he should be penalised immediately.

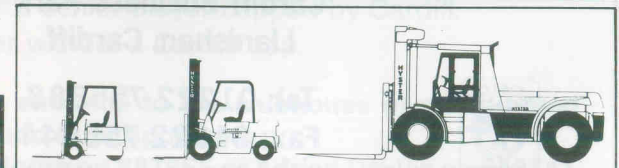
Finally, at the pile-up, a player waiting to receive the ball, normally the scrum half, is prevented from doing so and often pulled in to the pile up. This is illegal. **Players can touch the "scrum half" only if he has his hands on the ball.**
