COMING OUT for some air, are you? Too much turkey, too much wine, too much over indulgence — and time to get away from the washing up, the cigar smoke, the cracker jokes and the trivial pursuit?

In that case, spare a thought for the players this afternoon as they continue, no doubt in festive mood, to provide entertainment.

Not that those out on the Arms Park will be taking it anything but seriously. Certainly, we are well away from the pressure of Heineken League Rugby, but there are nevertheless reputations to be upheld or made, there is the chance to stake claims in what for both sides is an exciting season.

Both are well in the hunt for league triumphs — in the case of Cardiff to lift the championship and, in the case of Cardiff Institute, to earn promotion at the first attempt from Division Four to Division Three (the current top of the Fourth Division table is printed on page 7). The future of the Institute in Leagues is still under amicable discussion with the WRU with students at the college unable to play for other league teams.

Both are also still involved in the Cup, with the Institute's Fourth Round 32-3 win against Second Division Llandovery one of the major achievements in what is notoriously a giant-killing round.

On page 7 also, you will find the names of many famous "old boys" of the college, including the great Gareth Edwards but also including a welter of names who have both left an impression on World rugby but who are also still assisting in the coaching. John Paul and John Huw Williams are also deeply involved in coaching.

They are welcome to the Arms Park most warmly this festive afternoon, along with their players and supporters.

On Saturday, it's back to the hurly-burly of the leagues for Cardiff as we travel west to the Gnoll. The First Division table suggests that all is not well down over the new M4 extension but it would be a foolish man who travelled ill-prepared.

And that match, of course, will bid farewell to 1994. For Cardiff it's not been a bad old year. Cup winners and leading the First Division... it could have been worse.

Let's hope that 1995 is better still – for everyone. A prosperous New Year, then, from all associated with Cardiff Rugby Football Club to all here today – and, indeed, to everyone.



WHAT A BREEDING GROUND...

CARDIFF INSTITUTE, by whatever name, would come up smelling of rugby players — and, indeed, other sportsmen and sportswomen.

Over the years, whether it was Cardiff Training College, South Glamorgan Institute of Higher Education or, with its current title of Cardiff Institute, the production line of international sports stars continues — and, who knows, we may be seeing the growth of more this afternoon?

The team is having an impressive season in Division Four as can be seen from the top of the league shown below.

Those 28 tries show the spirit in which the game is encouraged. Indeed, only Rumney (50), Cardiff (46), Aberavon and Bridgend (with 35), Mountain Ash and Merthyr (33) and Pyle (30) have scored more in all five divisions.

The leading try-scorer with six is James Savastano, a name not unfamiliar to those who follow Cardiff youth rugby nor to those who like their Italian food.

and who is currently helping to coach the Institute, are among the Welsh caps.

Then there's Allan Martin (also still helping with the coaching), Clive Shell, Lynn Davies, John Williams, Clive Griffiths, Les Keen, Rhodri Lewis, Brynmor Williams, Kevin Hopkins, David Bryant, Stuart Davies, Tony Copsey and, coming right to the present, Paul John.

There's a substantial smattering also of Wales A and B Caps, including such former and current Cardiff players as Roger Lane, Kevin Edwards, Chris Webber, Geraint John and Colin Laity.

Jonathan Humphreys was there also — and we haven't seen the last of his representative honours yet.

Nor is it just Wales. Trevor Cheeseman, the former Swansea and England Under 23 international, was at the college, as were, among others, Colin Smart, the former Newport prop and England international, Stuart Jardine, who played for Scotland B as did Ruari Maclean. And there was recently also Shaun McGauchie, the Pontypool centre who also played for Scotland B.

Of the other sportsmen, the three most recently capped Glamorgan players, Hugh Morris, Greg Thomas and Steve Watkin, were all at the college at one time or another.

The girls, too, have represented Wales: Frances Margerison, Mary-Ann Harvey, Paula George and Wess Evans have all played rugby for the Welsh Women's side.






