

Richard Powell Appeal




Born and raised in Trimsaran, Nr. Llanelli, but now living in Rhymney Gwent, Richard has always had a competitive nature and as a schoolboy represented Dyfed in gymnastics, Wales at karate and also played rugby for Llanelli schoolboys, but his dreams of playing rugby for Wales were shattered six years ago, following a motorcycle accident which left him paralysed from the chest down. However, 16 months after being discharged from hospital Richard, now confined to a wheelchair was scoring new sporting successes through wheelchair racing. Specialising in 800, 400 and 200 metre events (Richard is currently ranked 3rd in the world at 200 metres), the sport has taken him to many parts of the globe. Richard also competes at longer distances having won the Dublin marathon in 1994.

He made history by being the first disabled athlete to be a member of the abled bodied squad at the Commonwealth games at Victoria, Canada, August 1994 where he came 7th in the marathon.



For the first occasion the Schweppes Cup Final went into extra time before Cardiff retained the Cup, winning it for the fifth time in seven years at the National Ground on May 2, 1987, in front of 37,500 spectators. The margin was 16-15 and it was ironical that Cardiff gave one of their most unimpressive overall performances of the season in a big game in which they emerged winners.

M.R. HALL - Centre. Date of Birth: 13.10.65. 6ft 1in. 15st. 0lbs. International Record: 39 Caps
Michael Robert Hall has skippered Cardiff for the last three seasons and fought his way back into the Welsh squad after injury. Started his
senior career with Maesteg and Bridgend and won Blues in 1987 and 1988 with Cambridge University. He scored a try hat-trick against
Portugal at Lisbon in May, 1994 in a World Cup qualifier and notched two tries against Canada at Toronto. A broken wrist against Tonga
finished his tour of the South Seas but he made a quick return to the Cardiff and Wales sides this season.

He is a BSc (Hons) in Economics and a BA(Hons) in Land Economy and is a Chartered Surveyor.

C. JOHN - Outside Half/Centre. Date of Birth: 20.2.73. 6ft 2ins. 12st. International Record: Uncapped Chris John is another versatile player who has appeared in three back line positions for Cardiff. Won caps for Welsh Schools Under-18, Wales Youth and Wales Under-19 as an outside-half and was in the Cardiff Youth team that won the Welsh Youth Cup at the National Ground in 1992. A student at Bristol University, he has seven Wales Under-21 caps.

S. FORD - Wing. Date of Birth: 16.8.65. 6ft. 0ins. 12st 7lbs. International Record: 8 Caps
Stephen Ford hails from a splendid Rumney family of rugby players that still support the local club, even though three of them have tasted success elsewhere. Older brother Phil turned professional and won 11 caps for Great Britain and appeared for Wales against France this year. Younger brother Edwin played first-class rugby at Pontypridd before breaking a leg. He has since returned to Rumney. Steve won the first of his eight caps against Ireland in 1990 and marked the occasion with a try. He is this seasons leading try scorer in the Heineken League.

He is a self employed carpet fitter.

C. LAITY - Centre. Date of Birth: 19.6.65. 5ft. 10ins. 13st. 7lbs. International Record: Uncapped Colin Laity was born and raised in Cornwall and represented the county in the English Championship final. He made three cup appearances for Neath in 1988, 1989 and 1990. Played for South and South West Divisional sides and England Students before opting to play for Wales on a residential qualification. He made his Wales B debut against France in 1988 and scored a try at the National Ground for the Barbarians against Asustralia in the same year. Captained the Welsh Colleges and South Glamorgan Institute and joined Cardiff three seasons ago. He is a teacher at Westbourne School, Penarth.

N. WALKER - Wing. Date of Birth: 15.6.63. 5ft. 11ins. 12st. 9lbs. International Record: 6 Caps Nigel Walker only took up the sport again after a ten year lapse two seasons ago. In that short time he has won six caps and twice scored tries against France and one against England. After failing to win a Welsh Schools cap he turned his attentions to athletics and became a world class high hurdler. He won bronze medals at the 1987 World and European Indoor Championships over 60m hurdles and was a semifinalist in the 100m hurdles at the 1984 Olympic Games. He reached two Commonwealth Games finals, finishing fourth and fifth, was fourth at the 1986 European Championships. He also ran at the 1987 World Championships and has a best 100m time of 10.35 secs. Notched a try hat-trick on his representative debut for Wales A in Holland.

A. DAVIES - Outside-Half. Date of Birth: 9.2.69. 5ft. 10ins. 12st. 10lbs. International Record: 6 Caps
Adrian Davies is one of the most talented all-round footballers in Wales. He set a Heineken League record of 264 points to steer Cardiff to
second place. After skippering the Welsh Schools, Under-18 and Wales Under 19 teams went to Cambridge
University where he won three Blues. He also won a Blue at soccer, a sport in which he won a Welsh Schools
Under 15 cap. Brothers Graham and Lloyd also played for Cambridge in the Varsity Match. Launched his senior
career at Neath and picked up a Division One winner's medal with them in the inaugural season of league rugby.

A. MOORE - Scrum-Half. Date of Birth: 6.9.68. 5ft. 10ins. 12st. 10lbs. International Record: Uncapped Andrew Moore was voted Man-of-the-Match in last year's Cup Final victory over Llanelli. Played for the Welsh Schools Under-18 team in 1984 and went on to play for the Welsh Students and Welsh Development Squad.

Scored the winging try for Oxford University in the 1990 Varsity match when he proposed Booth Had one season.

Scroed the winning try for Oxford University in the 1990 Varsity match when he opposed Booth. Had one seaason with Bridgend before returning to Cardiff.

M. GRIFFITHS - Prop. Date of Birth: 18.3.62. 5ft. 11ins. 16st. 7lbs. International Record: 32 Caps
Michael Griffiths won the first seven of his caps from Bridgend, a club he joined from Ystrad Rhondda. Started life as a soccer player before
turning to rugby and learning his front row trade under the expert eye of Ian Stephens. Joined Cardiff in 1989 and
toured Australia with the British Lions the same year. Missed the whole of the 1993 Five Nations Campaign after
breaking his shoulder in a mountain bike accident in Lanzarote. He is a self-employed builder.

J. HUMPHREYS - Hooker. Date of Birth: 27.2.69. 6ft. 0ins. 15st. 0lbs. International Record: Uncapped Jonathan Humphreys is currently employed by Cardiff as one of their two rugby development officers, along with vice-captain Hemi Taylor. He studied at Cardiff Institute and the Polytechnic of Wales and won Wales Student caps against France. England and Scotland in 1992 and England in 1990. He also played in the Students World Cup in Italy in 1992.

L. MUSTOE - Prop. Date of Birth: 30.1.69. 5ft. 11ins. 15st. 0lbs. International Record: Uncapped Lyndon Mustoe began is rugby at Chepstow Comprehensive School before joining the town side in the Monmouthshire Championship. It didn't take long for Pontypool to discover his talents and he joined them in 1990. He won honours for Wales at Youth, Under-19, 20 and 21 levels. Capped by Wales A against Holland and Ireland A and played again for the A team in four of their five victories last season. He is a bricklayer.

S. ROY - Lock. Born 25.12.68. 6ft. 6ins. 17st. 4lbs. International Record: Uncapped
Dr. Stuart Roy was a Christmas Day baby, born in Ely (Cambridgeshire, not Cardiff), but moved to Anglesey when very young. Educated at Menai Bridge and Bristol University (MB, ChB). Played for Bangor Youth and had one appearance for Neath.
Welsh Schools cap, toured New Zealand with Wales Under-19 and represented Wales in the Students World Cups of 1988 and 1992 in France and Italy. Won two Under-21 caps and was on the replacements bench for Wales at Twickenham in 1992. A qualified medical practitioner.

D. JONES - Lock. Date of Birth: 14.11.70. 6ft. 10ins. 18st.. 7lbs. International Record: 4 Caps
Derwyn Jones is one of the tallest men in Welsh rugby. He joined Cardiff after having played for both Llanelli and Northampton in 1992
whilst studying at Loughborough University. He began his first-class career with Neath and won Under-21 caps
against Ireland in 1991 and Scotland in 1992. A debut for Wales A followed against North of England at
Pontypool in October 1993 and last season he also played against Ireland A at Donnybrook and France A at
Cardiff as well as helping Cardiff to win the Welsh Cup. He is a Police Officer with the Gwent Constabulary. He

won his first full Welsh cap against South Africa on 26.11.94.

H. T. TAYLOR - Flanker, Born 17.12.64. 6ft, 2ins. 14st. 7lbs. International Record: 10 Caps
Hemi Takatou Taylor was born in Morrinsville. New Zealand where he had a trial for the New Zealand Colts before appearing in provincial rugby for both Waikato and Wairarapa Bush. He moved to Wales in 1986 joining Newbridge and making his debut against Neath that year before playing in over a century of matches for the Gwent club. He transferred to Cardiff for the 1992-93 season. He was awarded his international cap against Portugal at Lisbon in the World Cup qualifier, in May 1994 soon after recovering from an appendicitis operation. He is a Rugby Development Officer

O. WILLIAMS - Flanker. Date of Birth: 10.10.65. 6ft. 5ins. 15st. 7lbs. International Record: 1 Cap
Owain Williams is the younger of two brothers who have both played for Wales. Five times capped, Gareth also played in the back row, and
was a replacement on the British Lions tour to South Africa. It was in Namibia ten years later that Owain earned his only cap to date as No.
8 in the 34-30 second test win in Windhoek. He did, however, go one better than his brother ye scoring a debut
try. Won a Welsh Schools Under-18 cap against Canada in 1983 before going to South Glamorgan Institute. Won
Welsh Students caps against France and England in 1986 and 1987. First came to prominence on the senior scene
at Glamorgan Wanderers before joining Bridgend. Figured in the 1990 cup final for Bridgend when they lost to
Neath. Joined Cardiff two seasons ago. He is a TV designer.

E. W. LEWIS - No. 8. Born 29.8.68. 6ft. 4ins. 16st. 8lbs. International Record: 34 Caps

Emyr Wyn Lewis gained fourteen caps as a blind side flanker before having a spell at No. 8. His two-try performance at Windhoek in the
final test against Zimbabwe in 1993 was perhaps his best test display and he followed with an outstanding match
against the South African Barbarians. He was the Player-of-the-Year in Wales in 1992 and was in the Llanelli
side that defeated Australia that year. Educated at Ysgol y Dderwen and Ysgol Bro Myrddin, he appeared for
Carmarthen Athletic Youth before making his Scarlets debut. This season he switched to Cardiff. He is a Police

J. HEWLETT - Centre/Scrum-Half. Date of Birth: 30.5.74. 5ft. 8ins. 12st. 11lbs. International Record: Uncapped Jason Hewlett is Mr. Versatile at the Arms Park having played wing, centre, outside-half and scrum-half for the Welsh Schools Under-15 team before playing ouside-half for the Under-18 side. He reverted to scrum-half the following season and has alsoplayed for Wales Youth, Under 19 and Under 21. Missed five months of last season with knee ligament damage and was on the bench for every cup round. Is a student at Swansea Law School and has Wales Under21 caps.

A. BOOTH - Scrum Half. Date of Birth: 8.12.68. 5ft. 10ins. 13st. 5lbs. International Record: Uncapped Andrew Howell Booth was educated at Bishop Gore School, Swansea before earning degrees at Swansea (Hons in Business Studies) and Cambridge (Land Economy) where he also won Blues in 1989 and 1990. Played first for Neath while still at school and captained Welsh Schools. Welsh Students and Wales under-21. A cup finalist with Neath in 1988 and a Wales B cap. Andy has been on the bench for Wales 8 times - he was in the 1991 World Cup squad - without winning a full cap. He is an insurance broker.

M. BENNETT - Flanker, Date of Birth: 26.1.68. 6ft. 1ins. 14st. 7lbs. International Record: Uncapped Mark Bennett rejoined Cardiff from third division Ystradgynlais two seasons ago. Capped by the Welsh Schools Under-18 team in 1986, he went to study at Swansea University. Played for the Wales Students against England in 1988. England and France in 1989 and France in 1990. He also appeared in the 1988 Students World Cup. scoring a try against France.

H. STONE - Flanker/No. 8. Date of Birth: 1.8.61. 6ft. 3ins. 15st. 10lbs. International Record: Uncapped
Howard Stone packed down alongside former Wales team manager, Rob Norseter, in the second row in the Cardiff side that won the cup in
1987. A versatile and loyal player, he has also played across the back row for the club. Played for Wales A against Holland in 1993 and for
East Wales against the Japanese tourists last season. Was a try-scorer for East Wales against West Wales two years ago.

A. L. P. LEWIS - Prop. Date of Birth 13.6.73. 5ft. 10ins. 15st. 0lbs. International Record: Uncapped Andrew Leighton Paul Lewis who was educated at Christ College, Brecon after spending years in Togo as a youngster (because of his fathers job), scored a try on his last appearance at the National Ground - for Cardiff Youth as they beat Maesteg in the Welsh Youth cup final. Capped at under 18 Youth and at Under-21 levels. Andy is a student in Swansea.

H. R. BEVAN - Hooker. Date of Birth: 20.10.64. 5ft. 11ins. 14st. 6lbs International Record: Uncapped Huw Rowland Bevan was a prop for the Grand Slam Welsh Schools Under-18 team in 1983. He had previously won caps at Under-15 and Under-16 levels and went on to play for the Welsh Students while at South Glamorgan Institute before moving on to the Arms. Park. He is a schoolteacher.

M. A. RAYER - Full Back. Date of Birth: 21.7.65. 5ft. 10ins. 13st. 3lbs. International Record: 22 Caps
Michael Anthony Rayer is now recognised as one of the world's leading full-backs. He gained his first cap in the 1991 World Cup as
replacement for Tony Clement and has since taken the field as a replacement on five other occasions. He has been one of Cardiff's most outstanding full-backs and is as steady in defence as he is speedy in the counter attack. He joined Cardiff from the local Llandaff North club,
from where he had skippered Wales Youth at rugby and has scored over 300 league points in five seasons. He replaced Nigel Walker against
Japan and Scotland, scoring one try in the former and two in the left wing. His try-scoring continued with one for Cardiff in
the 1994 Cup final and another for Wales against Fiji at Suva. Also plays baseball for Wales B. Sadly broke his leg at Treorchy last October.

Saturday, 7th April, 1990

A moment of magic from John Apsee, the captain Cool of Bridgend, helped catapult his side into the Welsh Cup final. With Bridgend trailing 6-4 to gutsy Aberavon, it needed something special and Apsee provided it. He picked up eight metres from the line with the Aberavon defence covering the expected pass to his wing, he jinked back inside and scored a sparkling try which must have impressed the two male streakers. Bridgend picked up three tries altogether and just about deserved the daunting privilege of meeting Neath in the final. But Aberavon put up a brave fight at Stradey Park as they battled like tigers to foil their rivals who boasted six Welsh internationals. Aberavon harried and chased their opponents all over the pitch but they could not find a chink in the rock-solid Bridgend defence. Bridgend took the lead in the 12th minutes when flanker Mike Budd tore over for a try from the back of a scrum. Parry missed the conversion, but Bridgend were sure that their superior know-how would produce a hatful of points. Aberavon had other ideas and deprived them of any further scores before the interval. It was a nightmare of a day for the kickers of both sides as the swirling wind took the ball in several different directions after it was booted into the air.

Aberavon full back Lyndon Lewis was the first to find the target after 61 minutes of play. Bridgend were caught off side as they tried to stem a series of frenzied Aberavon attacks and Lewis made no mistake with a fine kick from 40 metres. Three minutes later Bridgend were caught off-side again and this time Neil Forrester succeeded from 35 metres to put Aberavon in the lead. With neither side seeming likely to score again it took Apsee's piece of magic to get Bridgend back on course. Aberavon lost two players through injury and this disrupted their pack in the later stages. Owain Williams took advantage and sped over from the back of a five metre scrum to collect Bridgend's final try, but Aberavon could hold their heads high after putting up such a courageous fight.




