Cardiff v. Glamorgan Wanderers

A very warm and sincere welcome is extended to our friends "the Wanderers" on this their first visit across the Taff to Cardiff Arms Park since 1st September, 1971. Our association in Rugby dates back to 1919 when games were played with the Cardiff Reserve XV. The initial First Fifteen game was played on New Year's Day 1927 — the year in which the Cardiff Committee decided to run two First Fifteens, or a First Fifteen and a second First Fifteen as it was so aptly described (*many thanks, Danny*). This of course was a disastrous experiment which lasted until 1931-32 season when the name of Glamorgan Wanderers re-appeared on the new Cardiff Athletic fixture list — christened "The Rags" by Syd Cravos in that season. We continued to play regular fixtures on a home and away basis for the next twenty years until 1952.

Unfortunately first fifteen fixtures with our nearest friendly rivals has been limited to only ten during half a century. With the Wanderers now commanding and enjoying a very good fixture list we all hope that our association flourishes. The city can certainly accommodate two first class teams. We wish the Wanderers a successful and enjoyable season.

We welcome supporters of both teams to this our first evening fixture of the season — let us hope that champagne Rugby alleviates mid-week depression this year.

For any of our loyal supporters who might be in some doubt as to who is actively involved in getting our teams onto the field this season, the Selection Committee consists of: First Fifteen captain; Rags Captain (Mervyn John); Coach and Selectors Tony Williams, Stan Bowes and C. D. Williams. This season the coaching is again in the hands — and very capable hands — of John Evans and Chris Padfield.

Congratulations to Mike Knill, who last Saturday against Maesteg scored the first try of the season in the second hundred years — not Mike's but Cardiff's second hundred! To Mike, Barry, Gareth and Gerald — congratulations on your selection for the Barbarians against the Lions at Twickenham next Saturday — what a pity Brynmor has to miss this historic Jubilee game, an honour that would have been true justice after playing in three tests on tour.

KNOW THE LAWS

In last Saturday's notes, the new law 28 — Free Kick — not differential penalty as is often quoted — was briefly introduced. Some expansion is necessary:

1. The free kick is allowed for a fair catch 'Mark' and after certain Laws have been infringed — mainly technical offences. It can be taken by any member of the team, can be any form of kick, can be taken in any direction. The kicker may be the next to play the ball, BUT a kick at goal is NOT allowed.
2. The team awarded the free kick can opt for a scrum on the spot instead.
3. The kicker's team must be behind the ball and the opponents 10 metres away. They can charge as soon as the kicker begins his run or offers to kick.
4. The kicker cannot feint or draw back; opponents must not creep up. If they do, the free kick will become a penalty kick.
5. If a player makes a 'Mark' for which a free kick is awarded and is then unfairly charged in the field of play it becomes a penalty kick. If in-goal, a touch down — minor — is awarded.
6. If the free kick is taken in-goal, the ball is in play if an opponent fairly plays it and a try may be scored.
7. Again, in in-goal, if the ball does not cross the line and a defender unfairly prevents an attacker from first grounding the ball, a penalty try may be awarded.

There's even more on it, but I think that's enough to go on with. I am sure you agree.

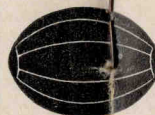

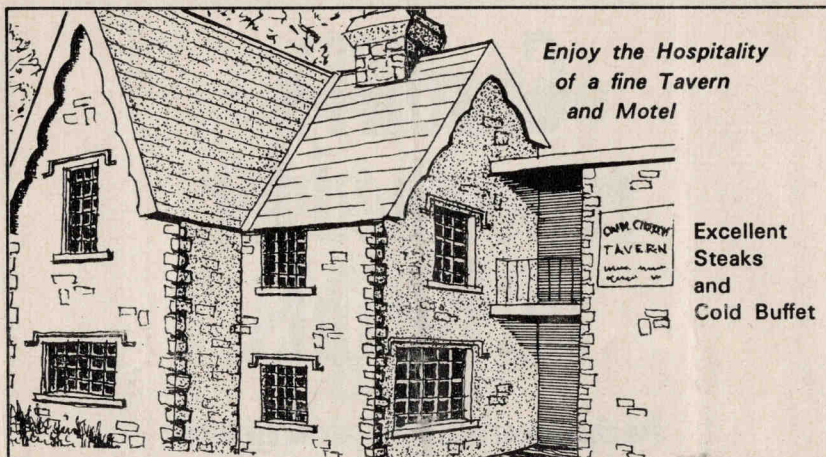

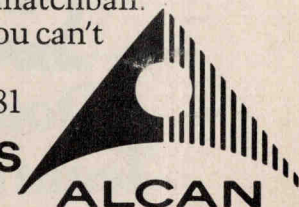
