



"Absolute Utopia. It really was, and still is, a place of sporting excellence"—Those were the words used by one of South Glamorgan Institute's most famous products, Allan Martin, to describe the College quite rightly called Welsh Rugby's greatest nursery.

Since its inception in 1950-51 Cardiff Training College, as it was then known, has produced 30 internationals for Wales, 11 of them capped while still students, one English cap and 14 British Lions.

In addition some 27 College or Institute products have represented Wales B, three of Wales' five National Coaches to date have come from Cyncoed and the first-class game throughout Wales and England is littered with top quality players who learned the finer points of the attacking game at the College.

The role it has played in Welsh Rugby can never be overstated and although there have been massive changes in the nature of the courses offered to the students, the refreshing and correct attitude towards how the game should be played still exists.

That the same spirit of adventure that helped educate such rugby greats as Gareth Edwards, J. J. Williams, David Richards, Dewi Bebb and John Bevan still exists is down to Institute coach Leighton Davies.

He took over the good work begun by Gwynne Williams and Roy Bish and has, for the past 20 years, preached an outstanding rugby gospel. His current side, as with so many of the predecessors, thrill crowds wherever they play as well as shocking a few of the established first-class teams.

The first College product to gain international honours was wing Haydn Morris.

Already a cap when he arrived, the College rugby team helped him become an established Cardiff player and he went on to win two more caps after leaving.

In the same side as Morris were Llanelli's Ray Williams, who won three caps, and Denzil Thomas, who played once in the Welsh centre. C. L"Cowboy" Davies and Billy Watkins were two more students who went on to win international honours after leaving the student ranks.

Flanker Geoff Whitson captained the 1956-57 College side and won his first cap against France while still a student. The following season saw a vintage intake of students, including four future internationals.

David Nash and Clive Rowlands not only went on to play for their country, but also became National Coaches and Big Five members, while John Davies and Bill Morris both won caps.

Rowlands led a 1960-61 College side which contained Dewi Bebb, while the 1964 side contained Tony Gray, a current Welsh selector, John Lloyd, a former National Coach, Brian Price and Keri Jones.

Gareth Edwards, John Jeffries and J. J. Williams teamed up in the late Sixties sides, while Allan Martin had John Bevan, Roy Bergiers, Clive Shell, Brynmor Williams and Colin Smart to keep him company in later College teams.

And so the long list of household rugby names moulded at the Cyncoed rugby academy continues up to the present time. Swansea centre Kevin Hopkins was the most recent cap, with Geraint John tipped to follow him into the Welsh side shortly.

Some of Wales and the World's finest rugby players have passed through the College's corridors and although much fine work has been done over the past 35 years, the same enthusiasm and standards exist today.


WELCOME TO CYNCOED
