

### Cardiff v. South Glamorgan Institute

Firstly tonight, it's apologies for such an abridged issue of the programme. This was necessary due to a culmination of circumstances caused by bringing tonight's game forward from the original date, Wednesday, in order to accommodate the BaaBaas extravaganza.

The programme may be abridged, but it certainly does not dilute our welcome to the students of South Glamorgan Institute, erstwhile Cardiff College of Education and erstwhile Cardiff Training College. Regardless of appellation however, as a centre of rugby the standard originally set and consistently maintained is one of excellence. This is a great tribute to their coach of long standing now and one of the best in the business, Leighton Davies.

The number of South Glamorgan Institute ex-students who have graduated to international status is growing year by year. Indeed on our last meeting which happened to be the first round proper of The Schweppes Cup last season another star was launched into international orbit. We won the game by 25-16 but it will ever be remembered for the performance of John Devereux. He proved to be a right handful for us and his play on the day earned him his first cap against England the following January. He has been an everpresent since then and has now made ten appearance in the red jersey. He becomes the fourth member of South Glamorgan Institute to be capped while still a student following in the steps of Gareth Edwards, John Jefferies and John Bevan.

Another who could further lengthen the list is John Devereux's current partner in the centre Colin Laity. Colin is a Cornishman and his form is such that many think he would be well at home in the English jersey and his national selectors must surely have such a fine player under consideration.

Tonight will be our seventh outing against South Glamorgan Institute and we have won all previous six scoring 154 points to their 65. Strangely enough three of the games have been in the Cup and we only scraped home by 7 points to 6 in the first year of the competition, 1971-72. So you can see that South Glamorgan Institute have been of a very high standard for a long time, and more recently, South Wales Police rather underestimated them last week and paid the penalty for so doing. So it's welcome to South Glamorgan Institute, we hope you enjoy the night.
