## Cardiff v. Llanelli

TUESDAY, 29th NOVEMBER, 1988 KICK-OFF 7.15p.m.

Tradition plays a great part in the livelihood of Welsh Rugby — and rightly so. What then would be a better example of such tradition than a Cardiff v Llanelli encounter. It has been going on now for some 107 years during which no fewer than 210 games have been played. Indeed the great tradition of both clubs has even stimulated debate in the House of Commons. An extract from Hansards of 17th April 1946 gives a brief account of a slight verbal altercation between James Callaghan and James Griffiths as to which of their constituencies could boast of the finest rugby club in the four countries.

Such is the history that has made the clubs known world wide. Circumstances however have paid no respect whatsoever to tradition. Consequently, and particularly so during the 1980s we have experienced a disruption of fixtures which is hard to believe. For some reason or another to have played on the pre-arranged date has been the exception rather than the rule. Incoming tours, cup commitments and weather have all been factors in this sorry scene of disruption and rearrangement.

Last season, as you may well remember we were due to meet three times to redress the balance because icy weather had intervened to stop the game at Stradey the previous season. True to form however after playing at Stradey we were unable to play on our ground due to a cup game postponement. Both sides then found it impossible to rearrange mutual dates so the three games for season 1987-88 became just one. And this after the sweat and blood lost by fixture secretaries of both sides.

The situation continues unabated and lo and behold here we are yet again meeting on a date other than that first scheduled. Last Saturday's BaaBaas v Australia game put paid to that so firstly we thank Lianelli for agreeing to come this evening because, unfortunately, another Saturday is just an impossibility. Furthermore our scheduled date for the visit to Stradey this season is April 29th, 1989. Now that's just one week before the cup final and a situation I will leave you to dwell on rather than me pass comment. Let's hope the future will treat us in a kinder fashion with agreeable mutual dates free of disruption being the order of the day and of benefit to both clubs.

As previously stated the series has already seen 210 games played, 115 of which Cardiff have won to The Scarlet's 76 with 19 games drawn. Points wise we have scored 2022 to their 1522. Behind those bland statistics however lies the blood and thunder that typifies the soul of Welsh Club Rugby. It has engendered a highly competitive rivalry between the clubs with the pendulum of success swinging one way and then the other.

Nothing is truer testimony of their situation than our respective records in the cup competition. The Scarlets dominated the scene in the early seventies and in all have appeared in seven finals, winning six of them. We were slow starters however but in all we have featured in eight finals, five of which have brought the cup to Cardiff. The probable highlights for each club in this truly magnificent competition came for us when we halted Llanelli's 26 consecutive wins sequence in season 1976-77, our centenary season. Their turnfor glory came again in 1985 when a Gary Pearce drop goal in the dying seconds snatched the cup from Terry Holmes grasp in a game which The Scarlets were rated to be very much second favourites.

The supposedly called domestic fixtures have also fluctuated in a similar manner. Llanelli's purple patch in the series came in the 1920s when a run of nine unbeaten games ensued, eight wins and one draw. Cardiff's turn came in the 1960s when an eleven games unbeaten sequence of ten wins and one draw resulted. The points scoring record sees Cardiff with the highest in any game with 45 but this is closely followed by the 41 points defeat we suffered at Stradey last season. Strangely enough The Scarlets last two visits to the Arms Park have resulted in a sixteen all draw on both occasions. Strange because the last time the sides drew was as far back as 1971.

Such is the rivaly then that has resulted in both clubs having a very healthy respect for the other. No doubt Llanelli would like to see their number of victories getting nearer to the Cardiff total and they see every game played as an opportunity to do so. Their form at present, with only three defeats in eighteen games would seem to make them favourites to do that very thing this evening. The three defeats have come at the hands of Leicester at home 27-7, Neath away 22-16 and Bath at home 25-12. Unavailability and injury have featured prominently on their scenario however and,

no doubt, could have been instrumental in those defeats. Jonathan Davies of course is a top box office attraction these days and hopefully he will be in action here this evening. Indeed once the Scarlets are in a position to field their best team there are not many around at the moment who will live with them. Such is their form and that of Neath even at this stage of the season it seems a good bet that, if the draw keeps these two clubs apart, we could well see a repeat of last years cup final coming up again next May.

There's a lot of water to flow under the bridge before then however so to Llanelli we say

welcome and thank you again on yet another rearranged date.

In speaking of the cup, our trip to Pyle didn't prove quite as hazardous as their coach Clive Shell had predicted prior to the game. His T.V. interview left you in no doubt as to who would be the victors. The pity of the afternoon however was the arrival of the rain which was not forecast and rather put the damper on the occasion. The home club had certainly made their preparations however and which all contributed to a good day out—well done Pyle, we wish you every success for the remainder of the season.

So the next hurdle comes in our home game against West Wales League club Amman United. Their progress to this, the fourth round was achieved after a high scoring but very tight away victory over Blaenau Gwent 27-26 — now you can't get much tighter than that can you. Like Pyle, we have not played them previously and they became the 45th club we have met in the

competition. More of that in the programme of the day however.

Last Saturday's game came well up to the standard of entertainment which is now expected of the occasion. The men from down under have certainly finished their tour in a more spectacular fashion than they began it. I'm sure they would give a million didgeridoos to have another crack at England. Their finger tip passing behind is a joy to watch and David Campeser must surely be the most entertaining player in the game today. The Lions have certainly been served notice as to what they can expect next summer when they visit Oz.

All that remains this evening then is to offer our sincere thanks to W.T. Davies Group Ltd. for their generous sponsorship of the game. We sincerely trust that Mr. Bill Davies and all his guests

will thoroughly enjoy the occasion.





## **KNOW THE LAWS**

## By J. E. MALCOLM THOMAS "REFEREES — IT'S HIGH TIME YOU GOT IT RIGHT"

Players in New Zealand and Australia know that if they stay on the ground after a tackle they will be rucked away from the ball. However, in Wales, we think that players should be allowed to fall on or over others on the ground, or lie on the ball without making any effort to get clear. MANY WELSH REFEREES ALLOW THIS TO HAPPEN, even though LAW 18 (1)(c) on the TACKLE states that "any other player must be on his feet BEFORE he can play the ball".

It is high time that players, coaches and referees in Wales changed their attitude and realised that rugby is played by staying on your feet. Those who lie on the ground are out of the game.

Pile-ups are illegal and an unsightly feature of Welsh rugby. Welsh referees have a duty and responsibility to outlaw and ban the pile-up.

A slight law change would help to tidy the situation, i.e. change "BEFORE" to "WHEN" so that "Any other player must be on his feet WHEN he plays the ball".


If we don't change our approach and attitude, next season's tour by New Zealand will inevitably lead to friction and controversy for they know how to ruck correctly. Many referees allow bad habits to persist.
