The Wanderers are very pleased to welcome their nearest neighbours, Cardiff, to the Memorial Ground for this afternoon's Heineken League Premier Division match, and in addition are also pleased to welcome, as their guests, some of the participants in this year's inaugural Ladies Rugby World Cup tournament, the final of which takes place at the Cardiff RFC ground tomorrow afternoon, Kick Off 3.00p.m.

Cardiff look like having to settle for a mid table finishing position in the Premier Division this season, but no doubt they will be looking to be there or thereabouts for the title next season. There has always been keen rivalry between the players in the club to be selected for the side to play in this fixture, and the players selected today are no exception.
