



Cardiff v. Llanelli

SATURDAY 23rd MARCH, 1991 KICK-OFF 2.30 p.m.

The 1990/91 Five Nations Championship is now part of rugby history with England finally getting the very much sought after Grand Slam for the first time in 11 years. All in all they probably deserved the honour because they stuck to a well drilled, though not a very pretty to watch, pattern. They were certainly made to work very hard for their victories. The whole championship was true testimony of the ever growing influence the almighty boot has on the game in general. England managed to cross their opponents line on only 5 occasions. Simple arithmetic shows us then that only 20 of England's 83 point total came by hand.

Last Saturday's game at Twickenham in which England clinched the title was a perfect example of how to win in modern day rugby. Three tries to one to France couldn't overcome the stranglehold the England pack had over the game. And what a try that first French score was. The sheer and classic execution from behind their own goal line conception to planting the ball between the English posts must go into history as amongst the best ever. With the power still invested in the boot however tries like this which should win matches still do not do so. Look at poor old Ireland, they crossed for 10 tries in their four games but still finished at the bottom of the pile.

Surely its now time that the governing body should have a good hard look at the method of scoring with the emphasis being put on the main aim of the game which is to score tries. Some weeks ago Mark Ring made the astute comment that New Zealand were adding their weight to the lobby that wants the penalty kick point reduced. He believed that they were heading in that direction because they have some outstanding back line players in the pipeline and running rugby would be the name of the game when it became their turn in the big time. We can but hope.

Our aspirations for this season's cup have also gone out of the window too after last Saturday's defeat at Neath. That was the same old story again where the boot was the predominant scoring factor. Just think, had the trusty boot of Paul Thorburn failed him on only one occasion, a 13-13 draw would have seen us through to the semi-finals by virtue of our 2 tries to their one. Had that then been the case many would have said we would have been lucky. I don't think such a comment would have caused me to lose much sleep, but its only wishful thinking.

The draw for the semi finals however means that at least we will not see a repetition of last year's final. Will it be Llanelli or Neath against Swansea or Pontypool, who knows. The only certain fact is that unfortunately Cardiff aren't involved.

Only a couple of seasons ago departure from the cup would have signalled a virtual end to the season with not a lot to look forward to. League rugby at least has put a stop to that rather negative thinking attitude because league points are still very much up for grabs. With the Pontypridd game of last January postponed, today's game is the first home league game we have played in 1991. And who better opponents could we wish for than the great Llanelli club.

Since the very first game played between our sides we have been very great but none the less very friendly rivals. That very first game was, rather ironically, played at Neath in the final of the old Challenge Cup on 12th March 1881. It proved to be a ding dong encounter with no score at full time. Extra time of 10 minutes each

way was agreed and in the last moments of the second of those periods Cardiff scored a try. The crowd stormed onto the field and as a Llanelli player refused to give the ball up the kick at goal could not be taken. I wonder if the players of that game 110 years ago realized that they were originators of two sides who were to scale the highest peaks possible at club level. Both clubs are known internationally and our rivalry as to which was more famous was even brought up in Parliament when Llanelli MP James Griffiths contested Cardiff's James Callaghan's statement that he represented the city which had the finest rugby club in the four countries.

Its been tit for tat all along the line with Llanelli the undoubted cup team of the 1970s with 4 victories, but we took over the mantle in the 1980s with 5 wins. Indeed our cup rivalry has seen us in opposition on 6 occasions with 4 wins to us and 2 to Llanelli. Significantly both Llanelli's victories have been at the final stage, once in 1973 when they well beat us by 30-7, and then there was that heart-breaking (for Cardiff fans of course) drop goal in the dying moments of the game that gave them a

15-14 victory in 1985. And long may this great rivalry exist.

At present Llanelli are in a nice and tidy situation. They are still involved in the cup and are in third position in the league. At this stage of the season they must be kicking themselves for their poor early season form. With the greatest respect to Abertillery, it was a massive surprise when they disposed of the Scarlets. Then again they failed to drive home the final nail in the coffin when Pontypridd played at Stradey and had 2 men sent off. A draw was all they could make of that situation. Those vital extra 3 points would have put them within a point of top of the table Neath and would have made the final outcome much closer than it appears it will finally end up. Their recent success at Neath must qualify as their best win of the season and has put them in very good heart for their remaining league games. They will come today looking for a league double because they have already accounted for us at Stradey. That was a game of two halves too. It looked as if we had the measure of them early on when we took a good lead. Their stalwart forwards came very well to the fore in the second half and they ran out final winners 22-16. The veterans in their pack, Phil May and Laurence Delaney are playing as well as ever. Phil Davies is another who rarely has a poor game, while flanker Lyn Jones is the thinking type forward who is adding another dimension to their already thrilling style of play. Behind the scrum, Rupert Moon has settled in at inside half and the present form being shown by outside half Colin Stephens is certainly heartwarming for the Scarlets. leuan Evans is another who is back to his world-class best so all in all Llanelli must be feeling quite happy with life.

Today will see us locking horns for the 217th time. Of the previous 216 we have won 117 lost 80 and drawn 19. Points wise we have recorded 2137 to the Scarlets



Don't forget we play Pontypridd in the rearranged league match at home next Tuesday.







KNOW THE LAWS

FOUL PLAY

What constitutes Foul Play?

Much has been said and written on this subject. Most supporters agree that:-


- (a) Kicking, trampling, raking and stamping;
- (b) Dangerous tackles, high, late, or early, and the use of forearm and elbow;
- (c) Head butting

should not be tolerated.

But should all these offences be dealt with by instant dismissal?

Please consider the following observations:-

- (1) The illegal use of the boot or feet is a sending off offence. However, the referee has got to be very sure what he sees and where the player's feet were, i.e. did he make contact?
- (2) You cannot tackle by the use of a forearm or elbow and, therefore, should be dealt with by dismissal.
- (3) Is a late or early tackle a mandatory sending off offence? Yes, if it's DANGEROUS. Otherwise, caution the offender and award a penalty.
- (4) Remember that as far as Rucking is concerned, ONLY the ball can be rucked and not players.





QUIDNUNC'S COLUMN

WHEN ALFRED HEFFELL arrived for interview by the senior worthies for the post of General Secretary of Cardiff Athletic Club one early autumn day in 1981, he did so with considerable diffidence. First of all he was unashamedly Scottish (born in Dundee in July, 1948) and, secondly, he had no rugby background. "All I could offer in sporting expertise," he recalls, "apart from normal schoolboy games, was in shooting. Indeed, I had already accepted another job in London, which I was not all that keen about."

True. But, if you dig a little deeper, you discover that Alf had a great deal of experience not only of sporting personalities — and showbiz — but also of what might loosely be considered as fringe

sporting activities. Like gambling and drinking.

Now don't get me wrong. Quidnunc does not insinuate that Alf Heffell, the Mike Gatting looka-like, is a habitually inebriated punter. On the contrary, although his eyes light up as those of a true Scot should at the mention of malt whisky (anything 40% and above with a mature McCallan as the favourite) and although he will talk at length about the legitimate returns of a casino, he is very much the family man.

As the result of job moves, he and his wife Lorna have produced three children in three different countries — elder son Douglas was born in Scotland, daughter Karen in England and younger son Craig in Wales. (Warm welcome this afternoon, incidentally, to sister Mary and brother-in-law Colin). Nor, clearly, would Mr. Heffell have become a Cardiff JP had his track record been

anything less than exemplary.

So what's this about an expertise in such divers subjects as blackjack and dice, and why would Quidnunc like him alongside at the roulette table? And why is it possible that a friendly neighbourhood croupier might ask me — and Mr. Heffell — politely to move along if he spotted us in cahoots?

Alf worked for many years for the Pleasurama Group, whose interests included casinos, discos, clubs and so on; as such he took courses on being a croupier and a dealer of cards, on how to recognise bar swindles and, as a general manager the entertainment of sporting star clients at race meetings, major boxing events, soccer matches and the like. Six years in Brighton (during the time when the Albion were a First Division side) were followed eventually by an appointment in Cardiff as chief general manager for the opening of the old Titos Club — now Tiberius.

That was in May 1979 and the Heffells quickly fell for Wales to such an extent that, when an opportunity came to move to London, they thought long and hard — and Alf moved on finally to join CAC. Here, since those days in 1983, he has seen the income at the club rise from £300,000 a year to close to a million, seen £100,000 spent on ground improvements, the building of the hospitality suites, clubhouse refurbishment both at the Arms Park and Sophia Gardens and, as he puts it, seen the club move from the abacus to the computer.

It's a long way from the days when he left St. John's School, Dundee, without qualifications and became a fitter at Jacksons the Tailors (remember them?). He took night classes as a cashier clerk, overtook his boss at a new job with a firm of jute brokers, and became a qualified chartered secretary. And, as befits a Scot once more, the financial side of affairs has always intrigued him.

Indeed, at one stage with Pleasurama, he and a group of colleagues were offered the chance of small basic pay and $1^{1}/2^{\infty}$ commission. They took the commission, ended up earning more than

the company's directors and were rewarded with the rules being re-written.

"To have a job connected with gambling like that," he says, "you need more rigorous checks than to find a position in a bank. You really do have to be cleaner than clean — and so does your family." And because of the knowledge gained, he is not as a former employee allowed to bet in their clubs. "Not," he stresses, "because of any fiddling but because you know the percentages. Indeed, when I was a group troubleshooter, you would know when some fraud might be going on simply because of the percentage returns."

Alf is, then, a behind-the-scenes man. At home, he reads avidly (novelists like Steven King and "long books because I read at about 40 pages an hour"), watches The Bill, Morse, Spender (but not American cops-and-robbers like Colombo or Cagney and Lacey). Smoked (or fresh) salmon and steak (or any fish dish) would be his perfect meal, he loves Wales (Tenby especially) the Channel Islands and Portugal, thinks nostalgically of his motor-cycling days (he belatedly learned to drive a car only when he discovered one he liked) and shies away basically from only one subject—international tickets. "People complain that they have not received one for years but they're on computer now and it usually turns out that they had one quite recently." Then we start talking Grand Slams and the Scottish mist settles over his eyes. "Last year was good for Scotland..."
