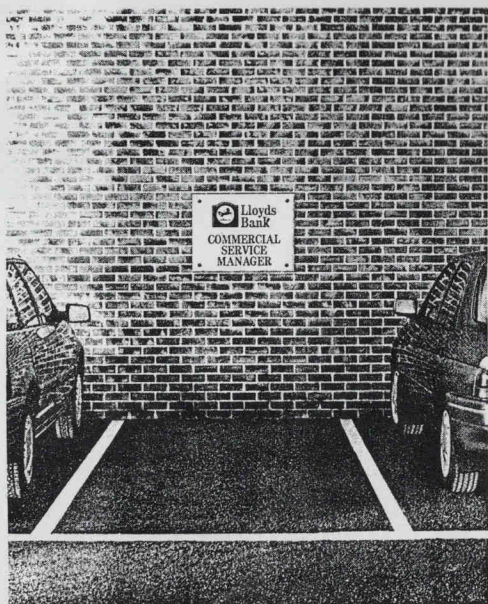

## Cardiff v. Bridgend

SATURDAY, APRIL 9th, 1994  
KICK-OFF 2.30 p.m.

WELL, as we warned before the match on Tuesday, there's no such thing as an easy cup-tie and the South Wales Police spiritedly ensured that Cardiff had to battle all the way for the right to meet Pontypridd in the semi-final at Rodney Parade next Saturday.

In order to televise live both semi-final ties — welcome enough in view of the relatively low capacity both of the Newport ground and at Neath where the holders Llanelli meet Maesteg — kick-off times will be staggered, with Cardiff and Pontypridd scheduled for 3.15 p.m..

And tickets — £7 for the grandstand, £3 for the terraces — were due to arrive at the Arms Park this morning but will be unavailable for sale until 10 a.m. on Monday for members and season ticket holders only.

Shortage of time as well as the limited number of tickets means that only personal applications can be dealt with.

Not all the Cardiff followers were enthralled by the performance on Tuesday but the fact remains that, with only a month of the season to go, Cardiff still have the chance of reaching the cup final and finishing in the top three of the Heineken League first division — hardly a disastrous year even for a club with ambition.

This afternoon Bridgend will certainly try to prevent our further climb up the table and, with unfortunate injuries and illnesses to the likes of Nigel Walker and Hemi Taylor, Cardiff have had to be somewhat circumspect with team selection.

Certainly, no one would wish to travel to meet Pontypridd at Newport next Saturday without the best available side — and all fully fit.

Over the years, too, Bridgend have threatened more than any other club to achieve parity of results with Cardiff. Of the 135 matches played since November 1881, Cardiff have won 64 against Bridgend's 57 with 14 draws — and they would no doubt wish to avenge this season's two defeats in the league and cup.

As always, their officials, players and supporters are most warmly welcomed to the Arms Park as they seek to consolidate their position in the top

half of the league.

Elsewhere this afternoon, arguably the most fascinating match is at Swansea where Pontypridd, still with realistic championship aspirations themselves, meet a side for whom victory would almost certainly confirm the league title.

Swansea entertain Aberavon on April 23 before coming to Cardiff on the final day of the league season.

Pontypridd, indeed, have a great deal on their plate. No doubt they would have welcomed a somewhat less crucial game immediately before the semi-final; the week after, they entertain Llanelli.

Other matches today see Neath visiting relegation-haunted Dunvant, Pontypool, who were done no favours when Llanelli lost at Aberavon on Tuesday evening, go down the road to Newbridge, Aberavon entertain Newport and Llanelli travel to Cross Keys with, almost certainly, only the cup in their minds.

Further down the ranks, Cardiff's Under 21s continue to play attractive rugby. Some of them, of course, were on show in the colourful Barbarians match a week ago but, also over the weekend, the 'official' Under 21 side won down in Exeter as a part of that club's 125th anniversary celebrations.

On Saturday, April 23, you have the chance to watch them for yourselves when they meet Newport Under 21s here at the Arms Park.

Meantime, it's back to the league and, once more, a welcome to our visitors from Bridgend, our match sponsors **Keyline Builders Merchants** and everyone at the Park today.

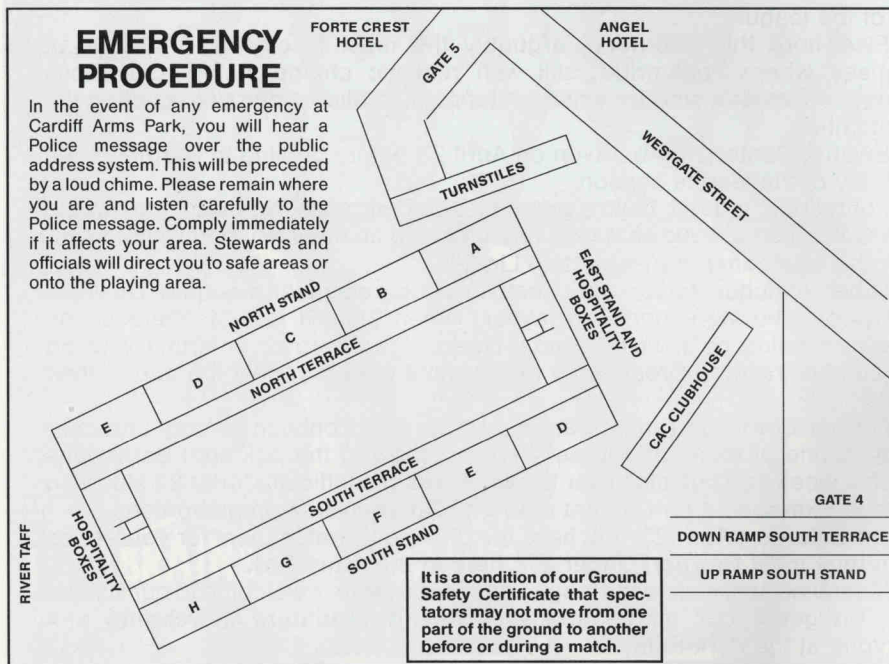

## CATERING FOR THE FANS

NEVER MIND the effect that league rugby has had on Wales' national sport, my biggest complaint about the so-called progress made in the modern game is that you can't get a cup of Oxo at the Arms Park any more.

Ever since the days I used to creep in the back door at the now National Ground to watch the Blue and Black heroes of the late sixties (No, John Nelson, I won't be caught for belated turnstile fees) I used to look forward to the half-time break and a cup of the magical beef drink... with plenty of pepper!

But what do you get these days? Overpriced coffee, weak tea or sugar-sweet, luke-warm canned drinks. Yuk! I suppose you can't complain about the burgers or hot dogs, although your stomach may do so within the hour of consumption, but where is the Oxo?

The point of this gripe is to make a stand for the all too often forgotten people in Welsh rugby – the fans. How often are their wishes taken into consideration when decisions about facilities, fixtures and other important matters are made in overcrowded, smoke-filled committee rooms?

It is at this stage that I have to put my hand on my heart – yes, journalists do have hearts – and say that the regulars at the Arms Park have a better deal than most fans around Wales. So, too, do the journalists.

But those people who sit in the comfortable seats on the half-way line, having been wined and dined for free before the game, must realise that it is not just a winning team playing attractive rugby that brings in the crowds. Good facilities are vital and must not be confined to the elite group who can afford hospitality boxes.

Those of us who frequent the press boxes around the country are used to shabby treatment, although not at Cardiff these days I'm happy to say, but those punters who pay good money to watch deserve greater consideration. So how

about more informative and better value programmes, perhaps without this kind of drivel, and what about more and better quality catering facilities? How many grounds do you know where you can't get a cup of tea, a packet of mints or a marmite sarnie? Loads... and it's just not good enough!

Then you have to consider the level of entertainment you get on the pitch. Many more matches like this week's SWALEC Cup quarter final and there won't be any fans to worry about!

You pay your money and what do you get – one match. Go Down Under, to South Africa almost anywhere and you are rewarded with two, three and sometimes four matches for your admission.

But what about the pitch, I hear you cry. The back-to-back SWALEC Cup semi-finals proved that you can play two matches consecutively on a ground without too much fear of the latter contest turning into a mudbath.

So please take note you committeemen with all the power, the public need to be enticed into a ground, well catered for when they arrive and given the opportunity to see more than one measly match.

Oh, yes, and would those people talking on the tannoy system, John Nelson excluded of course, please note that lucid and audible announcements are far more favourable than the majority of messages received, yet rarely understood, around the country. There is nothing more annoying than listening to Brian Wellington at Newbridge announce a home score as "that try for Newbridge by Steve Fealey", while the visitors get "try by I Evans".

Those of us who fill rugby grounds throughout the ever-lengthening seasons, media as well as fans, need greater consideration. In many ways we are the lifeblood in the modern game, where money and publicity are so vital to success.

And please bring back the Oxo!

Yes, it was on the first day of season 1984-85 that I was asked to write a little light relief while telling the Cardiff followers through a regular column of the pet foibles of our heroes.

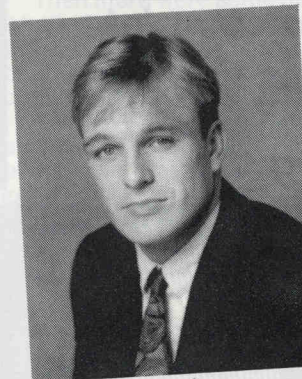

season 1986-87 by which time some famous names had come under the Quidnunc microscope.

Quidnunc, as I am frequently asked to explain, was an original Roman gossipmonger, a scandalmerchant and purveyor of half-truths about the famous people of the day.

And it was just that which a select group of notorious Cardiff players and Quidnunc undertook: the dissemination of facts and half-facts about their colleagues.

Basically, I originally had four finks, none of whom were prepared to let the facts interfere with a good story. Ineed, if material were in short supply, or a nickname not already in place, then the matter would soon be put right.

Occasionally, and to put researchers off the scent, we would write about one of them. A certain committee man, Dai "Gypsy" Hayward, was regularly accused of penning the scurrilous notes until he himself came under the Quidnunc microscope one afternoon.

By then, such notorious characters as Alan Phillips, Gareth Davies, Gerald Cordle, and Gareth Roberts had their nicknames of "Thumper," "Majid," "Teflon" and "Min the 'Orrible" told to the world as well as their eating, drinking and less savoury interests and habits.

In that first season, it was first revealed that John Scott owed Quidnunc 56 cigarettes (the figure was to rise to 327) and Gypsy Hayward 31 (the figure is now 234). For the first time, too, I wrote about farmer Bob Lakin's superb Christmas turkeys but, no matter how often I advised readers to buy their Christmas lunch from Bob, I never had a free one.

In that first season, also, I wrote about the chairman of the Cardiff Rugby Club as being the most unforgettable character I had met within the club. He remains unforgettable even though he is, alas, no longer with us. There was no need to invent stories about the legendary Rear Admiral Stanley Bowes...

I look at some of the names I have insulted and feel ashamed. Well, almost. Bobby Norster, Jeff Whitefoot and Ian Eidman, those who went north like Adrian Hadley, Bob Ackerman, Gerry Cordle and David Young.

Then there were some of Cardiff's genuinely golden oldies like Jack Matthews — I believe it was first revealed in this column that he once fought the distance with Rocky Marciano: as an amateur over three rounds albeit but the distance nonetheless — and Bleddyn Williams, Keith Rowlands, C D Williams (the real truth about that try for Wales scored on the far bank of the River Taff)...

There were plenty of other great personalities, too. Men like the late President, Les Spence. There were others, who did not stay long at the club, players like Peter Crane, Ray Giles, Andy Williams, Stuart Nunnerley, Paul Prickett, Robert Howley... all lampooned and cartooned (or, now, photographed).

Inevitably, Quidnunc's true identity became known to many people but the sources of information did not dry up. On the contrary: those who had been Quidnunced were only too eager to spill the beans about their colleagues.

Few serious mistakes have been made. I did try to marry off Howard Stone — who, incidentally, also appeared in that first season, the only current Cardiff player so to do although Mark Gerarde Ring was there also — to the wrong girl.

Even Howard and his wife took it in good part — as have all those who received the treatment. Even the Alickadoos recognised themselves from one particularly villainous Derek Stears cartoon.

In this 200th column, then, I would like to thank all of them for taking it in good part and heart — but mostly I would like to thank all those finks — John, Gareth, Alan, the Bobs, Chris, Mike, the Andys, Terry, Steve — for providing many of the hopefully humorous anecdotes. Keep it up...

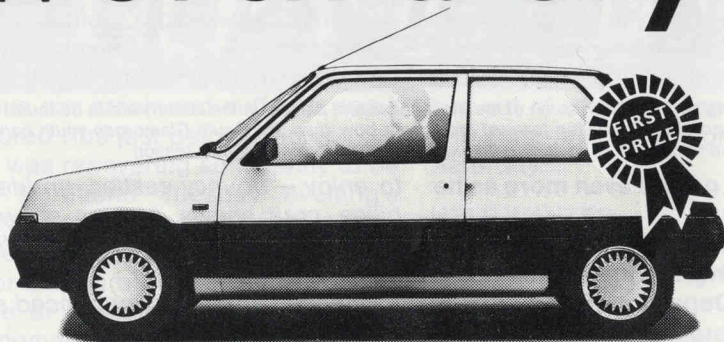

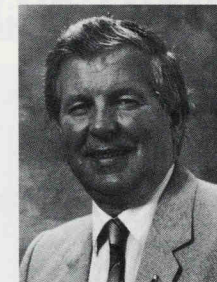

## KNOW THE LAWS

**J. E. MALCOLM THOMAS**  
talks about the talent at  
schools and youth level with  
a reminder about the  
variations to the laws.



### UNDER 19 LAW

The future of our game certainly lies in schools and youth rugby. I wonder how many reading this article have watched Under 19 rugby this season. There is a lot of talent, commitment and enjoyment at this level. If you want to see future potential, just watch Cardiff Youth or the senior school sides at St. Cyres, Penarth, Ysgol Glantaf, Cardiff, Cowbridge, Radyr, or St. David's College.

I also wonder how many of you realise that **Under 19 Rugby** has **Variations to the Laws**.

Here are a few:

- A. Up to **6** players may be replaced but only **3** substitutes may be allowed. A player, once substituted may only play again in the match as a replacement for an injured player.
- B. Matches shall be **35** minutes each way and **no extra time** is permitted if this total exceeds 70 minutes.
- C. (1) **Scrummages** must be at least 5 metres from the goal line.  
(2) Eight players (**maximum**) from each team are required to form a scrummage and all players must remain bound until the scrummage ends, however:
  - a) if one team is **1 short** then both scrummages must be a 3-4 formation.
  - b) if one team is **2 short** then both scrummages must be a 3-2-1 formation.
  - c) if one team is **3 short** then both scrummages must be a 3-2 formation.
- D. It is illegal to push the opposing scrummage 1.5 metres from the original middle line of the scrummage towards either goal line.
- E. The ball must not be held wilfully in the scrummage once control is established.
- F. In the event of no suitably trained players being available for the front or second rows, a **NON-CONTESTED SCRUMMAGE** will be ordered, i.e., no contest for the ball; the team putting in the ball must win it; and neither team is permitted to push.
- G. The **ONLY** player permitted to detach and pick up the emerged ball is the last man in a 3-4-1 scrummage.

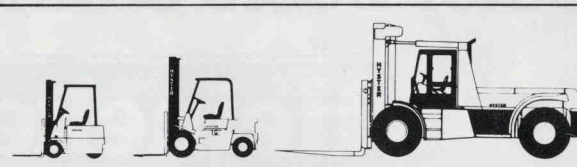
Finally, in the interests of safety, it is illegal for a team to adopt the flying wedge and the cavalry charge.
