



Cardiff v. Cambridge University

FOR THOSE with minds that rejoice in statistics and history, this afternoon's visit by Cambridge University to the Arms Park is of significance insofar as it is the 50th meeting between the two teams.

With that in mind, it is with special pleasure that we warmly welcome their officials and players, including, hopefully, two of our own, Stuart Roy and Adam Palfrey, who will at the very least feel at home.

University rugby may not retain quite the aura of yesteryear when their sides were filled — or is it a trick of memory? — with internationals. But even if things ain't quite what they used to be, you can be sure that the basics are quite certainly there: the wish to play entertaining and competitive rugby to the highest level.

The skills, alas, are not always apparent on showpiece day when Oxford and Cambridge meet at a packed-out Twickenham when nerves and guts are strained; this season's 20-8 victory for Oxford, for example, could in no way be described as a classic.

Oxford edged closer to parity in the record books as in the 112 match series to date Cambridge have won 51 times with Oxford on 48 and 13 draws since they first met in 1871-72.

Here at Cardiff, We have not been playing either for quite so long. We first met Oxford in 1888-89 and Cambridge five years later in 1893-94.

Cardiff have won 31 of the 49 matches played against Cambridge since then with the University successful 13 times and five matches being drawn. Points for 743, points against 478.

In fact, the fixtures between the clubs ceased from 1902 until after the Second World War because the University could only play in mid-week and because expenses and guarantees were too high. Since 1946-47, however, the sequence has been unbroken.

One of the more notable matches was in October 1970 as Cambridge won by a record 22-6 when a young gentleman called Gerald Davies ran in five tries for the University. Many Cardiff players have also worn the Light Blue jersey, of course, back to Harry Bowcott and John Roberts in the Twenties and including such names as Wilf Wooller, Cliff Jones and many others.

More recently, Adrian Davies won blues for four successive years between 1988 and 1991.

History, then, may favour Cardiff but Cambridge, seeking no doubt to build a side capable of beating Oxford next year, will certainly be trying their utmost in a match which also has other important implications.

The fitness of one or two Cardiff players will be under scrutiny, and none more so than that of Nigel Walker with a view to regaining his place on the Welsh wing against France next Saturday, a position bedevilled by injuries to both Nigel and to Llanelli's Proctor in Dublin last week, but which gave Simon Hill a further cap.


Sian is, of course, a member of the Junior Blue and blacks Club to whom the players would like to give their thanks for the rousing cheers at Llanelli a fortnight ago.
