

Cardiff v. Ayr

FRIDAY, JANUARY 14th, 1994 KICK-OFF 7.15 p.m.

IT IS very easy on the eve of an international to be side-tracked. The air is inevitably filled with nostalgia and bonhomie, when memories of great matches past blend with future ambitions and fears.

It is a time to relax and enjoy and it is in that spirit of rugby camaraderie that we offer the warmest of Arms Park welcomes this evening to the officials, players and supporters of Ayr Rugby Football Club and, indeed, to all others seeking a type of entertainment perhaps too far removed from the pressures of championships, leagues and cups.

Anyone who, in the past two or three years, has chanced upon an evening with Ayr and Cardiff, whether in Wales or Scotland, on or off the pitch, will know that the particular bonhomie of rugby fraternities lives on.

The result of the match is not all that important: not immaterial, for everyone likes to win, but the post-game entertainment at Ayr last year, for example, will be long remembered by those present.

Which is of course another reason to welcome our visitors from the balmy West coast of Scotland, opposite the Isle of Arran, down a bit from Troon.


Ayr is rapidly approaching its centenary year, having been formed in 1896-97 by former pupils of Ayr Academy. The school has always been a major source of recruitment over the years but the club is nevertheless "open" to outsiders.

Nor is it only on the rugby field that the Academy has featured in British, let alone Scottish, sport. Two legendary figures from the school, J Douglas Cairns and T B Watson, produced a school side which included a future English cricket captain in Mike Denness and a Scottish soccer captain in lan Ure. A formidable lad called lan McLauchlan, who went on to captain Scotland at rugby, was in the side although we understand he never played for Ayr, whose most capped player was S Munroe in the early 1980s.

The Cardiff links with Ayr, incidentally, also go back to the pre-war era when our own Ronnie Boon, who played some ten seasons at the Arms Park and won 12 caps for Wales, was recruited to teach at the nearby Marr College. Ronnie, indeed, became captain of the Ayr club in 1937-38.


More recently, Peter Thomas and Ray Cheney met a group of Ayr rugby men in Majorca and their conversations led to a first pre-international visit by Cardiff to Ayr in 1991. Thus a tradition began.

The matches with the Scottish Second Division side have, then, been fun on and off the pitch: this evening, there will surely be plenty of entertainment before the somewhat more serious business taking place next door tomorrow.

Nearly a month has passed since our last league match, the game with Cross Keys having been postponed through the weather and not yet re-arranged and our only other home match in January will be the SWALEC Cup fifth round tie with Oakdale next Saturday, the emerging Gwent club having beaten Builth Wells.

On January 29. Cardiff then travel to Stradey Park for an important Heineken League battle - important even though the bookmakers have largely written off the chances of both the title holders and ourselves.

The latest odds being offered are 8-1 against both Cardiff and Llanelli with Pontypridd at 15-2, Neath 7-4 and Swansea, not all that clear at the top and with some very difficult fixtures to come, quoted at 6-5 on.

Betting on the Heineken Second and Third Division titles, incidentally, has been suspended as Treorchy and Abercynon have moved steadily away from their respective fields.

In next week's Swalec Cup-tie programme, by the way, special articles will include both the chairman, Mervyn John, and the coach, Alex Evans, looking ahead to the year, articles which were due to have appeared on January 3 against Cross Keys.

And so to this evening's business with the hope that it will act as a curtain-raiser to a weekend of memorable rugby football and friendship. D.G.





