

Schools League Round-Up Lloyds TSB



Lloyds TSB Dragons Rugby Trust Schools League - Another Huge Success By Huw S. Thomas Schools & Youth Correspondent for 'The Western Mail' and 'Rugby World'

Today's Lloyds TSB Dragons Rugby Trust 1st Division Championship Final between Neath College and Ysgol Llanhari is the culmination of another hugely successful competition, which has seen Wales's top 12 schoolboy teams fight it out for the privilege of joining battle at the Millennium Stadium.

Since September, some 66 schools and colleges from all over Wales have been busy playing on Saturday mornings to earn a chance of getting to the Final of not only the high profile First Division Championship but also the 2nd /3rd Division Championship.

"There is satisfaction and delight at the quality and intensity of rugby in all Divisions of the League. It is a competition that has caught the imagination of both schoolboys and the public at large," said Dragons Trust Manager Arthur Jones.

"The proof of it is that next year we have even more schools and colleges entering and our aim of getting a hundred teams playing up and down the length of Wales is just a short step away." said

"We will be just short of ninety teams next season and we are delighted to see a North Wales group of eight schools and colleges coming into the league for the first time," said Wales' Director of Rugby Terry Cobner. " And what a boost it will be for rugby in the North to have boys fighting it out in a competitive environment on 14 League Saturdays to find the North Wales champions who might then go on to become Welsh champions of Division 2 and 3."

Today's game at the Millennium Stadium will be a re-run of last year's Final which Ysgol Llanhari won 37-10, although the West Glamorgan tertiary college got their revenge in the Welsh Schools Cup,

heating Llanhari 27-10 before going on to beat Cross Keys College 30-24 in the Final.

Neath College, winners of Pool 1B got to this year's final with a very hard fought win over runners up of Pool 1A Llandovery College 18-15, whilst the runners up in Pool 1B, Ysgol Llanhari, beat the Pool 1A winners Swansea College 25-12.

Prior to this year's semi-finals, the battle for play-off places in Pool 1A was very intense with three teams - Swansea College, Llandovery College and Cross Keys College - all finishing with 24 points after ten League games. It was hard on the Gwent tertiary college to be denied a semi-final play-off spot, as their backs

were probably the most exciting unit in the whole League but their points difference was markedly inferior to their two rivals.

Swansea College finished with a +164 aggregate, Llandovery +98 and Cross

The situation in Pool 1B was more clear cut as the top two. Neath College and Ysgol Llanhari were four points clear of third placed Brynteg CS.

The more tense of the semi-finals was at St. Helen's, Swansea on St. David's Day. Llandovery College with flanker Mark Bond catching the eye, were never headed

"A real humdinger of a contest," observed WRU Director of Rugby the approving Terry Cobner. "Swansea College competed well but the pace that Ysgol Llanhari played the game at is exactly what we want out of the League. And if we can get more sides performing like Llanhari, think how standards will improve in the Schools League and, hopefully in the Youth League, too, which will get off the ground next year."

Llanhari, coached by Iolo Roberts had prepared well to meet the challenge of the big and powerful Swansea College pack and the speed of execution of the basics and a desire to use the full width of the Brewery Field won the day in handsome

Man of the Match scrum-half Alyn Lake grabbed two tries but it was the outstanding breakaway unit of captain Justin Jones, Ceri Jones and Dean Fitzgerald that were the key to victory.

Wales U18 Youth crowned Champions

Wales Youth U18 retained their Four Nations crown, after a successful defence of their title in Dublin, with wins over Ireland, England and a draw with Scotland. The star of the Tournament was fly-half Gavin Henson (Pencoed), who bagged a total of 41 points during the competition.

After beating Ireland 20-3 in their opening match, Wales won their second game against England 21-14, despite trailing 11-6 at half-time. England's forwards dominated for most of the first-half, with a fine individual try by centre Chris Hyndman (Middlesbrough) giving them the advantage at the interval. Some determined defensive work by Wales' back-row men Tom Davies (Cwmgwrach) and Jonathan Thomas (Swansea) and some immaculate kicking by Henson kept Wales in touch.

With the Welsh scrum and line-out more dominant in the second-half, Henson was allowed to control proceedings and punished England's lack of discipline, with two neat drop-goal efforts in the closing stages giving Wales victory.

In their final game against Scotland, Wales were guilty of squandering chances, but did enough to earn their draw and bring the Four Nations title back to Wales. Locks Bryn Griffiths (Ammanford) and Rob Meredith (Cowbridge CS) were once again outstanding in the line-out with Henson and centre Adam Sliczny (Abertillery Steelers) combining effectively behind the scrum.

Some good work from Sliczny put wing Paul Mackey (Swansea) in for Wales' first try, which Henson converted, but Scotland hit back with a try from wing Andrew Dick and another by replacement No.8 Alistair Strokovich.

Henson struck his second penalty of the match to settle Welsh nerves, but Scotland finished strongly with another try from left wing Nick Walker to deny Wales
