Cardiff and District Rugby Union

T HIRTEEN years ago, when Cardiff local football was waning, and when recruits for the Cardiff First XV. were noteworthy for thier absence, a suggestion was made that a District Union should be formed to foster the game in the district.

In November, 1892, Messrs. R. W. John, A. H. Williams (Spokes), H. W. Wells, Geo. Parsons, and W. M. Tunley called a meeting of local clubs, and it was decided by the few who responded to form a Union of Cardiff and District Rugby Clubs. At the outset the Union had to contend with many difficulties, but eventually the Cardiff Football Club gave it support and the generous gift of a handsome silver Challange Cup by Mr. Thomas Mallett in 1893 allowed the Committee to risk holding its first competition. From six clubs in 1892 the Union has increased so rapidly that last season, with 56 affiliated clubs, it was the largest local amateur union (numerically) in the United Kingdom.

The one competition in 1892 has increased to the eight now held annually.

The Welsh Rugby Union has ever most generously recognised the work of the Union, and last season made a substantial money grant to its funds.

The work of governing the clubs affiliated appointing referees, settling match and club disputes is now very heavy, but the work is cheerfully undertaken in the interest of the game by the Committee and Officials, who render their services ungrudgingly without fee or reward.

Bye-Laws

1—That this Union be called the CARDIFF AND DISTRICT RUGBY UNION, and all Clubs within a radius of twelve miles of Cardiff be eligible for membership.

2—Any Club wishing to become affiliated shall be proposed and seconded by two Clubs belonging to the Union, and be elected by a majority of the Committee not later than Nov. 1st in each season for any competition matches.

3—That the subscription be 4s. per annum for each club belonging to the Union, with an entrance fee of 1s., to be paid on or before November 30th.

4—The Cardiff Football Club shall have the right of asking any member of a Union Club to play for them, such application being notified to the Secretary of the Club when a player is required.

5—That the Officers of the Union consist of a President, six Vice-Presidents, three of whom must be elected from members or past members of the Union or Union Clubs, Hon. Treasurer, and Hon. Secretary or Secretaries; to be elected annually. The Committee shall consist of one representative from each senior club and officers, and three representatives of

the Second and Third Divisions. No Club shall have more than one representative on the Committee. No member of a Club shall vote upon any protests or disputes in which his Club is directly interested, but shall retire from the Committee Room after the evidence in the case has been produced.

6.—That when necessary, a Referee's railway expenses shall be paid by the Union, but when the Home Club has a "gate," shall be borne by that Club.

7.—That the Committee shall have the power, in a vote carried by a majority of the members present at any meeting, to cancel or suspend for a time the membership of any Club-

(a) In case of wilful breach of the Welsh Rugby

Union Rules.

(b) The Committee shall have the power, on enquiry, to suspend for one or more weeks any player who has been reported by the Referee for offences against the rules adopted by the Welsh Rugby Union.

8.—That all Clubs in membership with the Cardiff and District Rugby Union be under the authority of the said Union, and be required to submit to the rules drawn

up by them.

9.—That all cases of appeal to the Committee, which must be in writing and reach the Secretary not later the Monday following the match, be accompanied by a deposit of 2s. 6d. The deposit to be forfeited if the objection be not sustained.

10.—Each Club within the Union shall be entitled to send two representatives to an Annual General

Meeting.

11.-Matches shall be played during the season as found necessary, the proceeds of which shall go to the funds of the Union, on which date the Union shall have first call on all players selected from affiliated Clubs, and that the Union shall, at their discretion, cancel any Club Match they may think fit in order to carry out the Union Match.

12.—Players representing the Union in three or more

matches be awarded a cap.

13.—The Committee shall be empowered to adjudicate on questions of broken engagements, and all disputes between Clubs in membership with this Union.

13A.—That in all competition matches any club directly interested in the competition may lodge an

appeal.

13B.—All appeals from the decision of the Committee to a General Meeting shall be made within 7 days accompanied with a deposit of 5s., which will not be returned if the appeal be not allowed.

13c.-Any player selected to play, or as a reserve for any team selected to represent the district, is debarred from otherwise playing on that date.

14.-No Club shall avail itself of the services of any player from any other District Union team unless his transfer has been obtained 4 days previous to such match. This rule does not debar a member of a second team assisting his first team.

14A.—Players of any Club not affiliated to a Union shall not play in any of the competition matches under the auspices of this Union after Dec. 31st, unless they have played for a Union Club three matches before this date in the same season. Players from Clubs unaffiliated to any recognised Union shall not under any circumstances play for any division lower than the first, unless the Committee are satisfied that the case is exceptional, and then grant their permission.

15.—Whenever a player transfers his membership from one Club to another, such transfer shall be legal

if-

(a) It be made with the sanction, previously obtained, of both Clubs concerned, provided that

- Notification of the sanction of both Clubs shall at once be given to the Cardiff and District Rugby Union Committee.
- (2) The Cardiff and District Rugby Union Committee may revise such sanction, and refuse the transfer in their absolute discretion. No player shall play for anoter Club until (a) he has obtained permission to do so from his old Club, or (b) until his transfer has been sanctioned and granted by the Cardiff

and District Rugby Union, who, in the event of this regulation being transgressed, shall have power to suspend the offending player or Club.

(3) Players transferring their services from one Club to another must pay the following registration fees before the transfer is valid:— From higher to lower divisions, 6d.; Club to Club in the same division 3d.; lower to higher division Club, free.

The Cardiff and District Rugby Union Committee will not sanction any transfer unless they are absolutely convinced of the *bonâ fide* character of the same. Overtures of any character made to a player to induce him to leave one Club for another may be considered sufficient cause for withholding the sanction of the Cardiff and District Rugby Union Committee.

(b) In case the sanction of one Club be withheld, the player in question, or the Club to which he proposes to transfer his membership, may apply to the Cardiff and District Rugby Union Committee, whose sanction shall render the transfer legal.

Any Club withholding its sanction to transfer shall be required to show cause for its action.

(c) In case of an unsanctioned transfer, the Cardiff and District Rugby Union Committee may (without inquiry) forbid the transferring player to join or play for the Club to which he proposes to transfer his membership, and in such case they shall at once hold an inquiry, when it shall be incumbent upon the player and the Club to fully satisfy the Union Committee as to the bona fide character of the transfer. Failing a satisfactory explanation the Cardiff and District Rugby Union Committee may either

(1) decline to sanction the transfer; or (2) suspend the Club or player, or both;

(3) declare the player a professional and suspend the Club.

16.—The Cardiff and District Rugby Union Committee reserve to themselves the right to adjudicate on any question that may arise in connection with these Rules.

17.—The Hon, Secs, shall convene a Special General Meeting at any time by order of the Committee, or on receiving a requisition to that effect, signed by the Secretaries of not less than four Clubs belonging to the Union, specifying the objects for which such Special General Meeting shall be called.

18.—Seven days' notice shall be given of an Annual, Special, or General Meeting.

19.-Notice of any amendment or alteration of the Rules, together with the names of the proposer and seconder of any such amendment or alteration, must be given in writing to the Hon. Secretaries at lease three days before the General Meeting at which such amendment or alteration is to be brought forward. No bye-laws shall be added to, altered, or rescinded without the consent of at least two-thirds of the members present at an Annual General Meeting.

20.—That the Committee select Referees where the Clubs interested are unable to mutually agree upon one; application to be made to the Hon. Secs, not later than

the Monday-week preceding the match.

21.—That a copy of the Balance Sheet be sent to the Clubs seven days before each Annual Meeting.

22.—Any question arising not provided for in these

rules to be decided by the Committee.

23.—That no Club fix any match with any Clubs outside Cardiff without a minimum guarantee of the

24.—That all Clubs forward to the Hon, Secs. Club Headquarters, the position of the ground, and register their Club colours, and Secretary's address. In Competition Matches no member of either Clubs be eligible to act as Referee between the two said competing teams, unless mutually agreed upon before the match.

25.—Any player playing three matches consecutively or more for the Cardiff Reserves must apply to the Union for permission to play in any Competition Matches.

CUPS AND SHIELD COMPETITIONS.

Bve-Laws

1.—That Competitions be instituted to be called "THE CARDIFF AND DISTRICT RUGBY UNION CUP TIES AND SHIELD COMPETITIONS"

2.—That the competitions be under the authority of

the Cardiff and District Rugby Union.

3.—That the ''Mallett'' Challenge Cup, as presented to the Committee by T. H. Mallett, Esq., be offered for competition to the Senior Clubs, and that a Shield and Cup be offered for competition amongst the Junior Clubs, providing at least six clubs are entered for same, the same to be held yearly by the winners in each competition respectfully, the classification of Clubs for the competitions to be decided upon by the Committee.

4.—That 16 Medals be awarded to the winning club,

one of which is for the Hon. Sec.

5.—That the Hon. Secretaries for the time being shall be the legal owners of the Trophies for the Committee, and shall hand over same to the respective winners each season, such Clubs to give security for the safe custody and return of the Trophies, by the 1st day of February in the following season.

6.—That all Clubs register the names of their respective Fifteen players and reserves (reserves of the first team not to be debarred from assisting their second team) with the Hon. Secs. seven days previous to the first competition match. No player shall play for more than one Club in the same Competition. This rule does not debar a member of a second team playing for his Club's first team. No transfers shall be permitted after March 1st from one Union Club to another in the same division.

7.—The Committee shall have power to deal with any official, Club, or Club's player or players as they think fit, and shall have power to deal with any other matter arising in connection with the Competitions not

provided for in these Bye-laws.

8.—Complaints respecting any Club in the Competitions or any match played thereunder must be given in writing to the Hon. Secretaries on or before the Monday following the match of such complaint arising, accompanied with a deposit of 2s. 6d., to be forfeited if the appeal be not sustained.

9.—The appointment of Referees shall be made by the Committee, and after such Referee is appointed no objection will be entertained to such appointment.

10.—The Secretary of the winning team (or in case of a draw both Secretaries) must communicate the result of the tie to the Hon. Secretaries by Monday's midday post of the playing of the same (the result to be recorded in the minutes).

11.—In the event of a Referee failing to keep his appointment and the two competing Clubs failing to agree to a Referee the match shall not count as a Competition Match, and the gate then assembled (net receipts) shall be equally divided, each Club paying its own expenses, and another date shall be arranged as a Competition Match, as per Rule 16.

12.—Neutral Touch Judges may be appointed by the

Committee at their discretion.

13.—In case of doubt as to the fitness of any ground for play, the visiting team and the Referee must be advised, and if after inspection of the ground the Clubs fail to agree as to its fitness, the Referee shall decide the matter, and his decision shall be final.

14.—Any matches unplayed by reason of bad weather or otherwise (failure of fixture excepted) must be rearranged mutually by the two Clubs concerned immediately; if unable to agree, the Committee will

arrange same.

15.—That the Competitions commence in March and continue each Saturday until finished. In case of a drawn game extra time to be played, such time to be solely in the jurisdiction of the Referee, but not to exceed 20 minutes. If still left drawn to be re-played on the visitors' ground on a day up to and including following Saturday. Either side refusing to play extra time, their opponents to awarded the match.

16.—In the event of the Committee being able to obtain any enclosed ground the semi-

Finals must be played on same as ordered by the Committee, the Union taking charge of same

FIRST, SECOND & THIRD DIVISION LEAGUE RULES

These Rules are Governed by the Bye-Laws.

1.—That Leagues be instituted, to be called the "Cardiff and District Rugby Union Senior and Junior Leagues."

2.—That the management be vested in this

Committee.

3.—All matches shall be played under the Rules of the Welsh Rugby Union, and shall be of not less than 60 minutes' duration.

4.—The scoring shall be by points—two points for

a win, and one point for a draw.

5.—The Club scoring the greatest number of points shall be declared the Champion Club of the respective competitions for the season.

6.—In the event of one or moe Clubs being equal in points, another match or matches shall be arranged, upon such grounds as the Committee may appoint, the net proceeds of such match or matches being divided equally between the competing Clubs and the Union.

7.—That 16 medals be given by the Union to each of the winning teams, one of which is for the Hon. Sec.; medals for the Reserves, &c., if required, to be purchased by the said winning Club.

8.—In the event of any match or matches not being played owing to frost or any other cause over which neither Club engaged has any control, the match shall be played upon a date to be fixed by the Committee,

unless otherwise mutually arranged.

9.—No player shall take part in any match or matches who is not qualified in accordance with the Rules of the Welsh Rugby Union, and no Club shall avail itself of the services of any player unless his transfer has been obtained six days previous to such match taking place. This rule does not debar a member of a second team assisting his first team, but the conditions of the byelaws must be fulfilled.

10.—The Committee shall have the following powers:— (1) The decision of all questions of qualifications; (2) the adjudication upon questions of broken engagements and the fixing of dates for matches that cannot otherwise be mutually arranged; (3) the consideration of all protests, disputes, and complaints arising out of the competitions; (4) the decision of all questions of the Championship.

11.—All appeals must be accompanied by a deposit of 2s. 6d. (which will not be returned if the appeal be not sustained), and must reach the Hon. Secretaries by Monday following the match, otherwise it will not be

considered.

12.—All applications for transfers must be made at least 4 days previous to date of use.

13.—Any questions arising not provided for by these Rules shall be decided by the General Committee. 14.—That no Clubs be allowed to play for 4 points without the special sanction of the Committee.

15.—Players in the Third Division must not be 20 years of age on or before Sept. 1st in each season.

16.—Any Club presenting Certificates that have been tampered with or otherwise altered for the purpose of misleading the Committee will lose the appeal, two points deducted from them, and will be fined the sum of 5s. The player or players so altering will not be allowed to take any further part in the Competitions. (This also applies to the fourth division.)

FOURTH DIVISION JUNIOR LEAGUE COMPETITION

These Rules are Governed by the Bye-laws of the Union

 That a Fourth Junior League Division be formed in connection with the Cardiff and District Rugby Union.

2.—That the annual subscription be 2s. 6d., to be

paid before October 30th.

3.—That the management be vested in a General Committee of one representative from each Club, including the Chairman and Secretaries, the Committee haveing power to over-rule any proposition or amendment that has not been carried to their satisfaction.

4.—All Matches to be played under the Rules of the Welsh Rugby Union, and shall not be of less than 50 minutes' duration.

5.—The scoring shall be by points, two points for a win and one for a draw.

6.—The Club scoring the greatest number of points shall be declared the Champion Team in the League.

7.—In the event of one or more Clubs being equal in points, another Match or Matches shall be arranged, upon such grounds as the Committee may decide.

8.—That 16 medals be given by the Union to each of the winning Clubs, one of which must be for the Hon.

Sec.

9.—In the event of any Match or Matches not being played owing to frost, or any other cause over which neither Clubs engaged have any control, the Match shall be played upon a date to be fixed by the Committee, unless mutually arranged.

10.—No player shall take part in any Match or Matches who is not qualified in accordance with the Rules of the Welsh Rugby Union, and no Club shall avail itself of the services of any player who has not received his transfer six days previous to such Match

taking place.

11.—All appeals must be accompanied by a deposit of 2s. 6d., which will not be returned if the appeal be not sustained, and must reach the Secretary not later than the Monday following the said Match.

12.—No player must take part in any of the Matches in this competition whose age exceeds nineteen on

September 1st.

13.—Any question not provided for by these Rules shall be decided by the Committee.

Important Alterations and Additions to Rules of the Game.

THE following alterations and additions are now in force:-

Field goals are abolished.

One player on either side can now form a scrummage.

The Referee must blow his whistle when:-

(a) A goal is kicked.

(b) When the ball goes into touch in goal.

(c) When the ball or a player carrying it, touch

Touch Judges must in future stand behind goal posts for the purpose of assisting the Referee when kicks at goal are being taken, without waiting to be asked by him.

Goal from a Mark now counts 3 points instead of 4.

Definition of "held" is when a player carrying the ball cannot pass it.

It is no longer necessary that the catcher should himself kick or place the ball. This can now be done by himself or any other player of his side.

Wilfully puts the ball unfairly into a scrummage, or the ball having come out, wilfully returns it by hand or foot into the scrummage.

This is an important alteration, and the Committee wish to emphasize the fact, that a penalty must now be given for returning the ball into the scrummage by the foot as well as by the hand.

The ball must either be thrown out at right angles to touch line or scrummaged at the spot 10 yards from such touch line.

Stoppage of play.—In case of an injury to a player, or in any other case, the Referee shall not permit play to stop fo more than three minutes.
