LAST TIME OUT

Glamorgan Wanderers - Cardiff

Cardiff RFC held a competitive training session at Glamorgan Wanderers last night that saw most of the squad have a run out in game conditions.

The session started with the forwards having lineouts and scrums against the Wanderers pack both offensive and defensive before two 20 minute sessions under normal game conditions took place. The starting XV for the first session was Lewys Montague, James Beal, Lloyd Chalke, Will Rees Hole, Oli Smyth, Gareth Thompson, Mike Hale, Ken Dowding, Ryan Spriggs, Rob Lewis, James Murphy, Chris Smith, Ben White. Tom Wilson. Reuben Tucker.

The Blue & Blacks spent most of the session in defensive mode and held the Wanderers at bay. When they did get the ball the spun it wide to try to create space. The one try came following a fantastic break by Lewys Montague. He fielded a kick through in his own half before showing great pace to beat most of the Wanderers defence. His chip through into the twenty-two was expertly picked up off the floor by James Beal who flicked it on to Ryan Spriggs who crossed in the corner.

Taunton 19 Cardiff 42

Cardiff ran out comfortable winners at Hyde Lane against a spirited Taunton side that made them work hard in the early stages.

It was the home side who had the better of the first of three 30 minute periods. They pressed had and dominated possession for most of the period. But, on a day when the weather even tempted the coldest of committee members to go without a jacket, the Blue & Blacks backline wanted to run with the ball. Owen Lane's break paved the way for the opening try finished off by James Beal after a great timed pass from Rhodri Cole.

The Titans got on the board a few minutes later when Isaac Downton went over, but Cardiff's lead was extended when Lane again went through this time his pass allowed Reuben Tucker to cross. Gareth Thompson converted both.

In the second period with several changes in both sides it was more of the same. The forwards were now working hard to secure more ball and that was used to great effect whne Pat Lewis sped down the flank to put Codey Rees over. It wasn't all attack though, defensively the Blue & Blacks were sound with Llwyarch Ap Myrddin solid at full back and the back row of Ben White, Luke Crciker and Tom Wilson outstanding. The forth try was a second for Codey Rees before Will Rees Hole, who had been a thorn in the Titans side, crossing for the fifth.

The final period saw three more tries, two for the Titans before the pick of the games tries by Owen Lane. Picking up the ball near the half way line the centre ghosted through the static defence before popping on the after burners to scre. Gareth Thompson converted for a final score of 42-19.

Cardiff 12 Carmarthen Quins 5

Cardiff won a tight last pre-season friendly against Carmarthen Quins at the Arms Park. The game saw several changes to the side that beat Taunton the week before due to Blues call ups and a couple of knocks picked up along the way. The Quins started brightly and their scrum became a dominant feature of the first half for them, earning several penalties that put them in good field position. That was to be thwarted though by outstanding Cardiff defence. On several occasions the Quins threatened the line but were held at bay by staunch tackling.









The only area that the Blue & Blacks will want to work on the defence around the fringes as the Quins broke through that area several time. Those breaks though were stopped by the back three. The defence of Ceri Young, Pat Lewis and Llywarch Ap Myrddin was outstanding as the stopped what seemed certain tries on at least three occasions.

Cardiff were always on the back foot. When they had the ball they looked to go forward and the partnership between 9, 10 & 12 was developing nicely. Rhodri Cole was a live wire at scrumhalf around the fringes and Gareth Thompson and Will Rees Hole combined to set up several chances, unfortunately the last pass didn't go where the Blue & Blacks wanted it.

The Quins were the first on the board. For once Cardiff simple ran out of defenders. The ball was whipped wide and Lewis Millen was able to scramble over. The stirred Cardiff and then took the lead after the forwards had put Cardiff in a great position. Thompson fired the back line and when he found a galloping Cory Tucker he was able to put him through a hole in the Quins defence for the in Quins defence. The second row still had a bit to do but was able to make it to the line for a try that Thompson converted.

The second half saw Cardiff attack with much more determination. Rees Hole and Daffydd Smith were causing the Quins no end of problems and with the pace of the back three the Blue & Blacks looked likely to score every time they had the ball. Only stout defence from the visitors and a couple of adjudged forward passes stopped that from happening. Cardiff did eventually get their second. Great build up work by Ap Myrrdin and Lewis put the Quins on the back foot, and Thompson was again the provider as he sent Man Of The Match Rees Hole over. That proved to be the last score and Cardiff will now look forward to the start of the Premiership on Sunday at Rodney Parade

It has been a few months since the Principality Premiership ended our 140th season. In the first programme of the 141st we look back over the last few months at the Arms Park.

After the last game Cardiff RFC looked forward to the end of season dinner that also celebrated the end of 140 years of Blue & Black rugby. Legends of the game turned out at the Principality Stadium to see the presentation of the caps for this season to Gareth Thompson, Ben Leung, James Beal, Jack Davies, Luke Crocker and Jordan Viggers. Four players were presented with their blazers for 100 games - James Down, James Murphy, Jonathan Edwards and Tom Slater. Phil Steele was the guest speaker and compare for the evening that culminated with Mervyn John being the latest inductee to the Cardiff RFC Hall Of Fame. Mervyn has of course been a Blue & Black through and through, as a player, committee man and as a trustee of the rugby section of the Athletic Club and his induction is well deserved.

That closed the old season but on the rugby front there were changes in both the coaching and playing staff. On the coaching front Steve Law was appointment as Head Coach. 'Spot' had been at Bedwas for 16 years and will bring his vast knowledge of the Premiership to the Arms Park. His appointment was described as the Chairman as "a perfect fit for the Blue & Blacks" and Steve himself said he wouldn't have wanted to leave Bedwas for any other club. We can look forward to hearing Steve's views on the game in future programmes.

Steve also brought with him his own assistants and we welcome former Blue & Black Llyr Lane - backs coach, James Dixon - conditioning, kicking and assistant coach, and Neil Edwards – forwards coach, to the Arms Park. We wish them all good luck through the season. We will catch up with them all in due course. On the playing front several new players joined the ranks and they will no doubt add to the quality we already have in the squad.

In the pack the Blue & Blacks have added three props. Fraser Young and James Greenfield have signed from Newport. 31 year old Cardiff born Greenfield has also played at Virginia Park for Caerphilly while Fraser Young is a 21 year old who has played 11 times at Rodney Parade.







Ken Dowdin has also signed from the British Army and will bring a wealth of experience with him having played for Bath and London Irish as well as stints in the Premiership with Bedwas and Bridgend. Ryan Spriggs has signed a contract to play for the Blue & Blacks having impressed in several games during the 16/17 season.

In the second row Corey Tucker comes in from Penallta In the back row Bristol born Tom Wilson joins from Moseley having previously played in Wales with Cardiff University and LLanharran. He adds to the resources in the back row with Ben White, Dan Crimmins and Reuben Tucker already having already returned to the Arms Park. Miles Normandale also returns to the Arms Park following a spell at Rotherham.

Behind the pack scrum half Rhodri Cole makes the move from Parc-Y-Scarlets to the Arms Park having played 18 times for Llanelli last season. Adam Jones moves from Ebbw Vale and Pat Lewis - who scored 16 time for Bedwas last season - adds to our centre options. Full back Llywarch Ap Myrddin - Larry to his friends - changes Black & Amber for Blue & Black having played 23 games at Rodney Parade last time out.

Added to that are are allocation of Cardiff Blues Academy players. In the pack the Blue & Blacks welcome back some familiar faces with prop Rhys Carre, hooker Ethan Lewis and second row Seb Davies all having appeared last season. They are joined by back row Jim Botham and prop Tom Mably, both of whom have been involved in the pre-season fixtures. Second Row Joe Miles completes the forward list.

Behind the scrum outside half Ben Thomas, who played in the final few fixtures of last season will join centres Owen Lane and Dafydd Smith. Owen Lane has been a regular with Cardiff having made his debut in 2015. Dafydd Smith has just one appearance so far against Skewen at the beginning of last season. 
