Since the war this match has always been a dour struggle, hard and unrelenting, but to-day's match promises an enjoyable contrast. Cardiff are still unbeaten, both home and away, despite a narrow escape with a weakened side at Stradey Park last Saturday.

Neath, with a young and speedy back division, are also enjoying a good start to the season. They defeated Llanelly two weeks ago, easily accounted for Penarth last Saturday, and defeated a strong British Police XV this week.

With both sides playing the open game. Neath, with newcomer Frank Williams at scrum-half, should do well in attack for he proved a fine player with Swansea last season. Vivian Evans is at fullback again; Ken Maddocks, a track runner and final Welsh trialist of last season, is on the left wing, and his duel with Terry Cook of Cardiff promises to be the highlight of the afternoon.

W. D. Smith on the other wing is also a "flyer"; Leighton Davies a promising centre and Leonid Morgan a sprightly outside half. Between them they should take full advantage of a young and lively pack. The loss of three experienced front row forwards has not been felt as yet. 
