CARDIFF R. F. C. YOUTH TEAM REPORT 1998/1999 SEASON

In many ways the Jubilee season of Youth Rugby at Cardiff was the epitome of the curate's egg. It was good, very good, in parts and in other ways, it was disappointing. The good was the exciting way in which the team played, which was recognised by the award of the Western Mail 'Team of the Month' title in December, the bad included the early exit from the Welsh Youth Cup, the team having been given the bum's rush by the demolition squad from Pontypridd the following week.

In terms of player development for the first team and International representation it was an excellent season and in that there will be a loss of the throughflow of players via the under 16 and under 17 teams, it bodes ill for the future.

It seems that with the early season 'takeover' of the greater part of the responsibilities of the Welsh Youth Rugby Union by the Welsh Rugby Union and the consequent increase in the number of Schools participating in the Schools League, fewer players will be available for selection by Youth teams. Effectively, Youth rugby will consist of a one year band of players whose ages are over 18 and therefore too old for Schools representative honours and under 19.

But, I digress. This last season began with an away trip to Maesteg under the new captain, Phil Wheeler. The team were made to work very hard for their eventual 17 - 7 win. There followed the celebration Jubilee game against the Welsh Youth President's XV at the Arms Park with the President's XV paying Cardiff the compliment of fielding nine Youth Internationals with two more on the replacements' bench. It was a thrilling game, sadly watched by only a small crowd. At the end, one conversion separated the teams, the President's XV winning by 35 points to 33.

The remainder of September saw the team defeat English opposition in the form of Northampton and Wasps comfortably and a creditable draw against the Saracens Development team of under 21 players.

October brought satisfactory victories against Welsh opposition in the form of Pontypridd and Llanelli and before their first round Welsh Cup game, they totally overran a Leicester Colts team by 58 points to 12. Thus invigorated, they almost repeated the score against Tandu in the Cup winning by 57 points to 18.

There was no game between that game played on 21st November and the
